MCAC Committee Member Guidelines

The purpose of the MCAC includes:

- providing a forum for effective communication
- recommending policies, suggesting changes in programs, and evaluating services
- reviewing stakeholder opinions and needs
- evaluating health plan marketing materials, such as member handbooks and notices

The MCAC has the following members:

- 17 voting members
 - 9 voting members are beneficiaries or advocates of beneficiaries
 - 8 voting members are providers
- 4 non-voting members from DHHS
 - Behavioral Health
 - Children and Family Services
 - Developmental Disabilities
 - Medicaid & Long-Term Care (MLTC)

Serving on the MCAC includes the following expectations:

- Being prepared to participate in meetings
- Attending meetings regularly
- Bringing your unique perspective to the meetings
- Taking part in discussions at meetings
- Being willing to listen to the ideas of others, and working together
- Committing to trying to serve your entire term
- Declaring any conflicts of interest, and not voting on any of those issues

The MCAC will elect a chair and vice-chair, who along with the MLTC Director will meet as needed in between MCAC meetings.

The MCAC will receive MLTC staff support to perform its work. MLTC pledges to actively listen to MCAC's advice, and will explain its reasons whenever the advice might not be taken.

The public is welcome to attend MCAC meetings and will be able to provide comment near the end of meetings.
