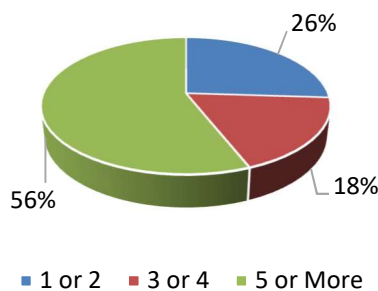

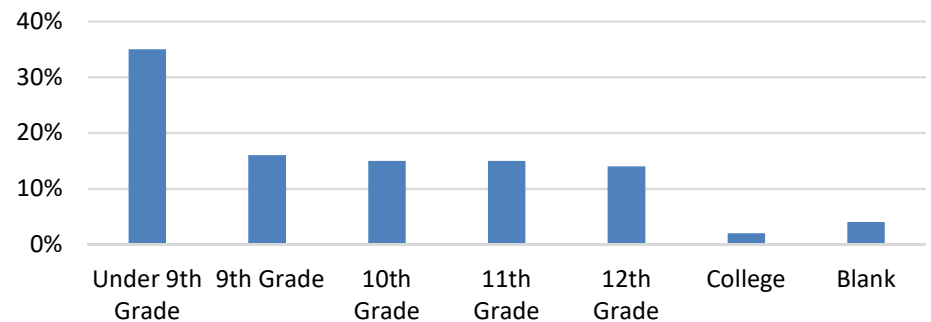

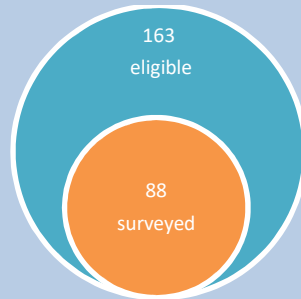

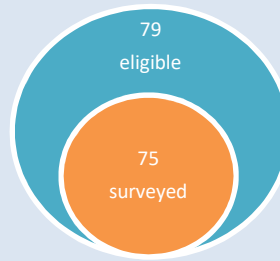
Cohort 2 survey participation, FY 14-18

(17 year-olds in foster care, FY 14)



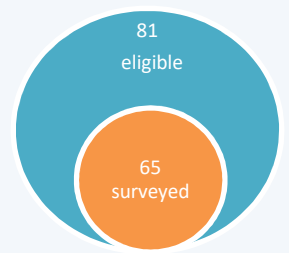
54% surveyed
