State Adoption Resources

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- A child may qualify for Adoption Assistance when the child has been determined to have special needs (age 8 or older at the time of adoption, a sibling set of 3 or more to be adopted into the same home or the adoptee has at least two siblings placed in the same adoptive home, has a diagnosed disability or a Medical/Mental Health Professional has determine the child to be at risk).
- The assistance paperwork must be completed before the date of adoption.
- Assistance may include monthly maintenance to support the child's daily needs, medical coverage, non-recurring expenses, and other assistance.
- When a child's needs increase requiring more support or interventions by the caregiver, an application can be made for an increase in financial support. Families may contact their assigned IMFC worker (Income Maintenance Foster Care is within the Division of Children & Family Services) for any questions.

Supportive Services for Adoption, and Young Adults

Education & Training Voucher Program (ETV): Central Plains, 308-872-6176 www.central-plains.org ETV Programs are available to youth who achieved permanency through adoption/guardianship after age 16. Program for youth ages 17-24, provides financial support for current and former state wards to attend the college of their choice. The ETV program provides students with financial assistance for tuition, fees, and books.

 When the child was in foster care and are adopted, they have access to Connected Youth Initiative/Project Everlast (CYI). Youth can access CYI programs from ages 14-26. Programs include Central Navigation. Coaching, Financial Literacy, and Youth Leadership.
