Nebraska *Olmstead* Advisory Committee Charter and Guidelines

Background and Current Purpose

The *Olmstead* Advisory Committee was formed and began meeting in August 2018 in order to assist in the drafting of Nebraska's first Olmstead plan, in collaboration with the Olmstead Steering Group. The initial plan was completed and submitted to the legislature in December 2019. An updated and revised plan was completed and submitted to the legislature in XXXXX 2023.

The current purpose and design of the the Advisory Committee is to serve as the stakeholder voice and group that advises on and reviews the status of plan outcomes, strategies, and goals of the *Olmstead* Plan. The Advisory Committee collaboratively assists in the review and development of the *Olmstead* Plan, provides on-going advice on implementation, refinement, and future updates and revisions to the plan. The Advisory Committee also provides advice on the many topics addressed by the Olmstead plan and topics important to Nebraskans with disabilities.

The Advisory group includes individuals with disabilitites, providers and other state agencies not represented on the *Olmstead* Steering Group.

Membership

Pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 81-6,122, the Chief Executive Officer of the Department of Health and Human Service shall appoint and convene a stakeholder advisory committee to assist in the review of the Olmstead Plan. Chairs

The Advisory Committee will consist of two volunteer Advisory Committee Members. Chairs shall be elected by the Advisory Committee for two-year terms without term limits.

Open Meetings

When appropriate, Advisory Committee meetings will be open to the public and conducted in accordance with the Open Meetings Act, Neb. Rev. Stat. § 84-1407 et seq.

Member Duties

- 1. Attend Advisory Group meetings, if unable to attend, it is requested than an informed, alternate representative attend;
- 2. Participate in workgroups, as appropriate;
- 3. Prepare for participation in discussion and providing input by reviewing meeting materials;
- 4. Vote in Advisory Committee meetings; and
- 5. Inform the member's agency or stakeholder group about Advisory Committee activities and actions.

DHHS Responsibilities

- 1. Provide materials to the Advisory Committee members in a timely manner prior to Advisory Committee meetings;
- 2. Provide support for regular meetings including online hosting and recording Advisory Committee meeting attendance, minutes, and votes;
- 3. Provide support to workgroup committees including online hosting;
- 4. Provide the Advisory Committee with relevant updates to their work; and
- 5. Assist with obtaining the information requested by the Committee.

Meeting Frequency

The Advisory Committee shall meet at least once quarterly, or four times per year, in advance of the Olmstead Steering Committee, in order to provide status updates on the implementation of the Olmstead Plan and advice and recommendations regarding plan implementation and revision.

Establishment of Workgroups and Task Groups

In order to monitor the implementation of the Olmstead Plan and ensure its success, the Advisory Committee shall establish workgroups and task groups as appropriate to monitor progress, provide recommendations and feedback, and address topics or actions which further the goals of *Olmstead* within the State.

Workgroups shall be organized to address each of the goals of the Olmstead Plan, including Community Supports, Data, Education, Employment, Housing, and Transportation. Each workgroup shall be led by a chair voted on by Advisory Committee. Chairs shall be elected by the Advisory Committee for one-year terms without term limits.

These groups shall meet at least quarterly, or four times per year, in order to provide status reports and recommendations for future action to the Advisory Committee. Workgroup status reports should be submitted using established status reporting templates. *See Appendix A-E*

The Advisory Committee may establish task groups to address other topics or actions which further the goals of *Olmstead* within the State by majority vote. Each task group shall be led by a chair voted on by Advisory Committee. Task groups shall report regularly to the Advisory Committee until dissolved by majority vote or one year since task group formation unless extended by majority vote.

Set Agenda

The Advisory Committee will include at minimum the following agenda items at each regularly scheduled meeting:

- 1. Update from each workgroup
- 2. Update from each task group
- 3. Recommendations for plan implementation actions/activities
 - a. These recommendations should be voted upon and submitted to the Steering Committee. See Appendix F

Process for Reviewing Olmstead Plan revisions and updates

The Advisory Committee shall recommend any revisions or updates to the Olmstead Plan once per year to the Steering Committee. Recommendations should be voted on by the Advisory Committee and must be submitted to the Steering Committee and DHHS no later than March 31st for consideration.
