Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) Waiver

WHAT IS THE TBI WAIVER?

The TBI Waiver provides specialized services to people ages 18 and older, who are diagnosed with a traumatic brain injury, are nursing facility eligible, and want to receive services in the community. Waiver services are intended to reteach skills and abilities lost due to their TBI.



WHAT TBI WAIVER SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE?

TBI Waiver services include:

- Adult Day Health
- Assistive Technology
- Caregiver Training
- Chore
- Community Connections
- Companion
- Home Modifications
- Home-Delivered Meals
- Non-Medical Transportation
- Personal Care
- Personal Emergency Response System (PERS)
- Respite
- Supported Employment – Follow-Along
- Supported Employment – Individual
- Supported Residential Living
- Vehicle Modifications



WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE TBI WAIVER?

To be eligible for the TBI Waiver, a participant must be ages 18 or older, be eligible for Nebraska Medicaid, have a diagnosis of traumatic brain injury,* meet the level of care for a nursing facility, and have a need for waiver services.

**This program is not intended for people with an acquired brain injury caused by strokes, tumors, or other non-traumatic causes.*
