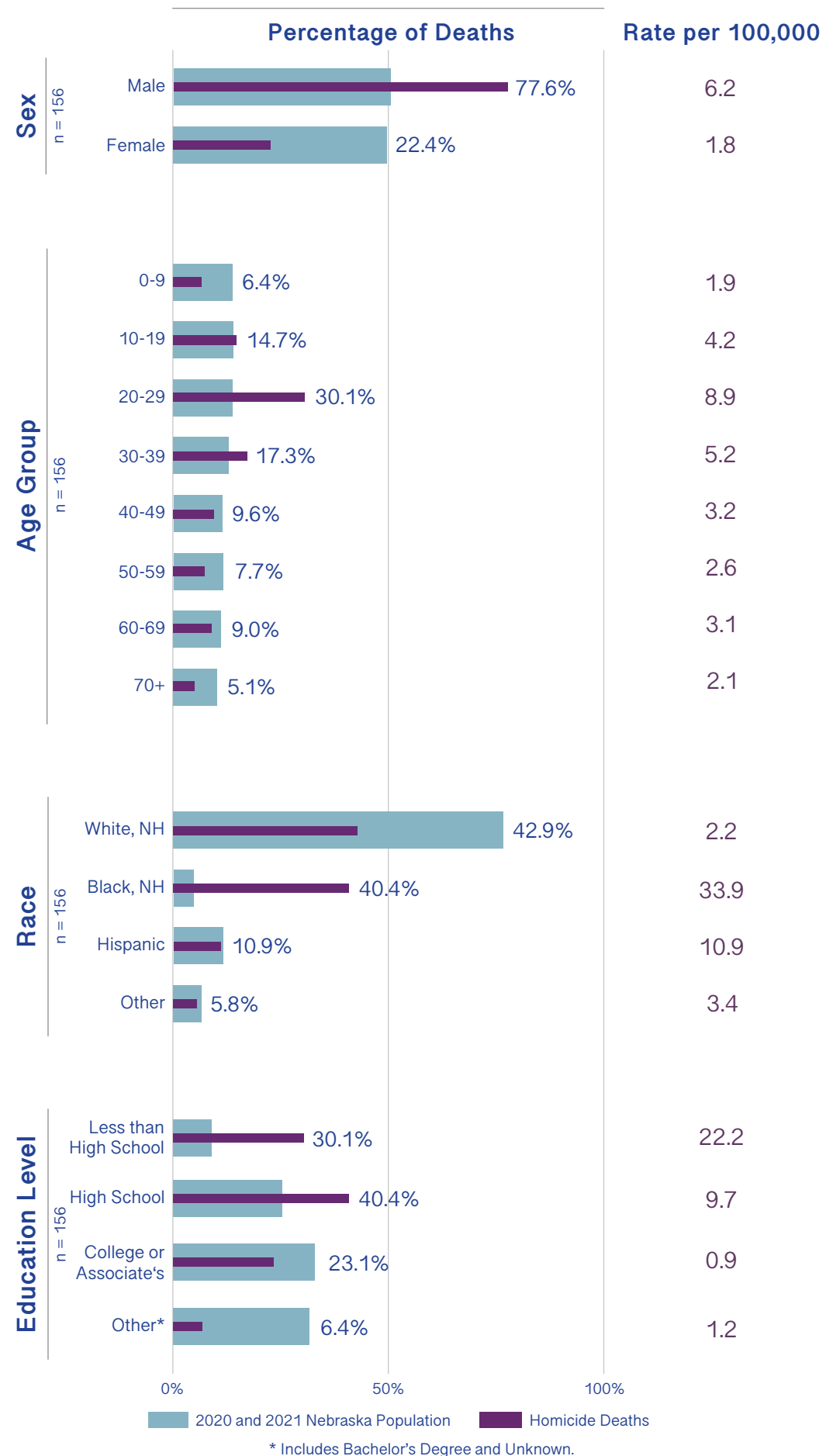


# CDC NeVDRS - 2020 and 2021 Summary of Homicide Deaths in Nebraska

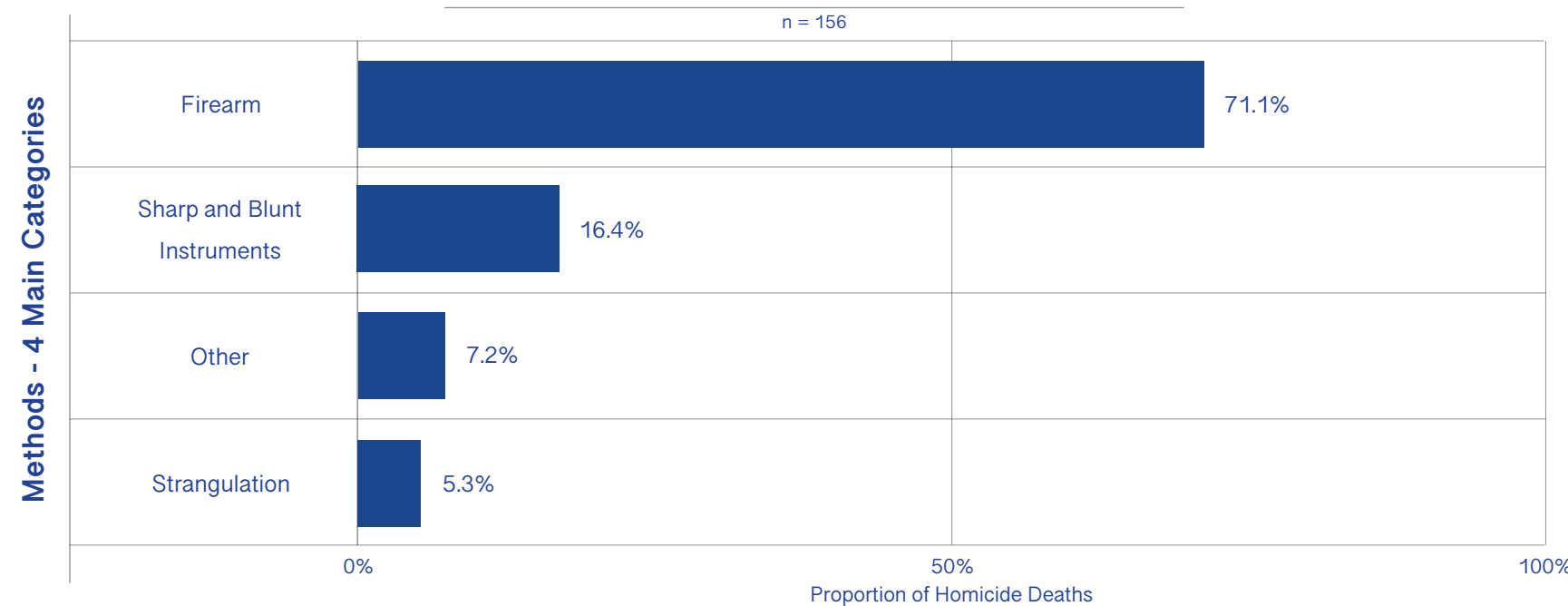
156 Total Deaths (4.0 per 100,000 Population)

## Demographics

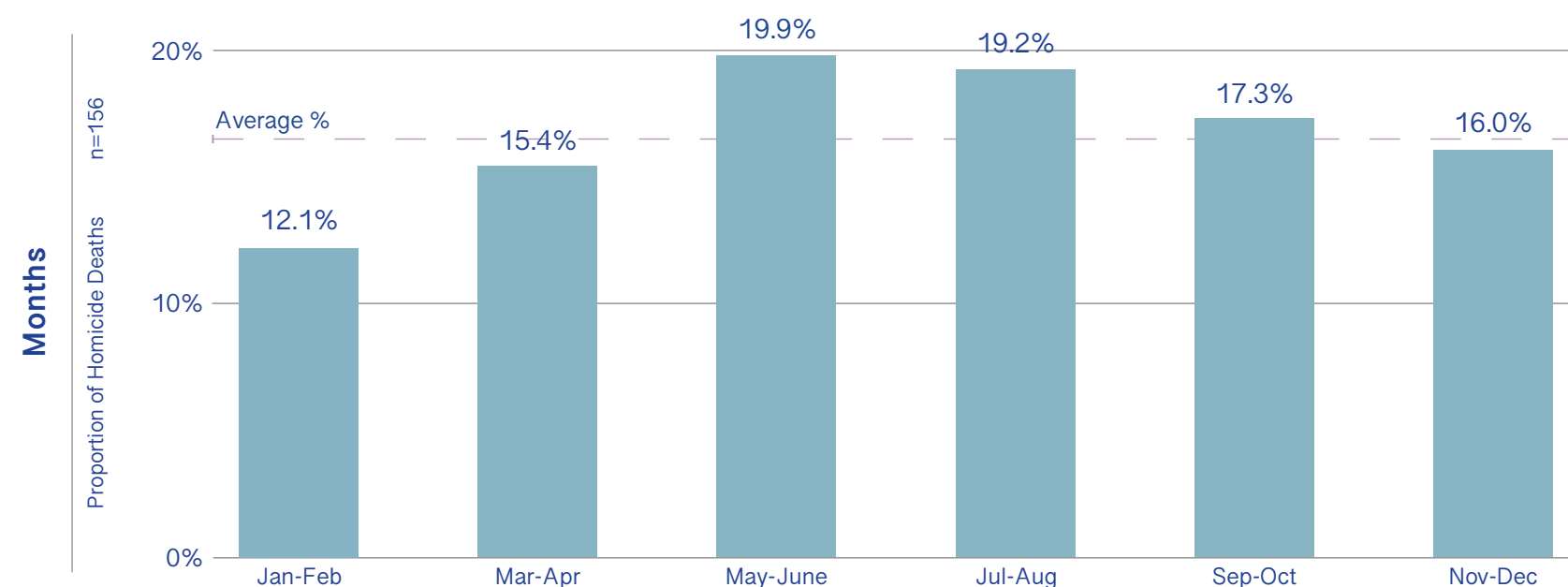


Demographics in Nebraska homicide deaths in 2020 and 2021 were not reflective of the population demographics. Black and Hispanic people died by homicide at higher rates than White people given their population size in Nebraska. Other risk factors that surpassed the Nebraskan population demographics were being male, between the ages of 20-29, and having a high school degree level of education or lower.

## What methods were used?

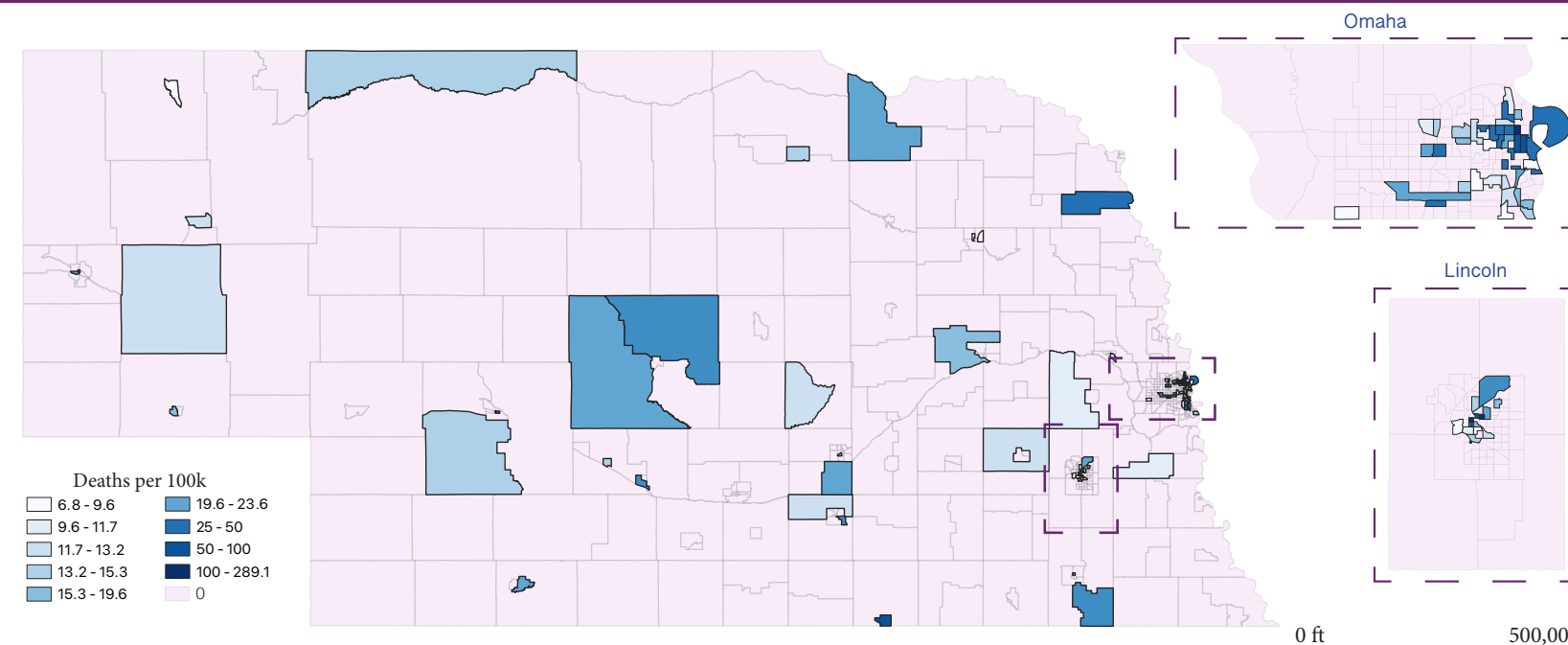


In 2020 and 2021, individuals were most likely to be killed through use of a firearm.



The highest percentage of homicide deaths in Nebraska occurred in May to August in 2020 and 2021.

## Homicide Death Rate by Census Tracts



The darker blue areas on this map represent the highest rate of homicide deaths in Nebraska in 2020 and 2021.

23.8% of total victims had a history of non-alcoholic substance abuse problems.

10.2% of total victims had a history alcohol problems.

5.4% of total victims were killed during an illegal drug dealing.

8.2% of total victims were killed by a random act of violence.



19.0% of deaths were classified as gang motivated.

44.2% of total homicide deaths took place in a residence.

86.4% of total victims had emergency medical services present at the scene.

25.9% of total victims had 60 mins or less survival time.

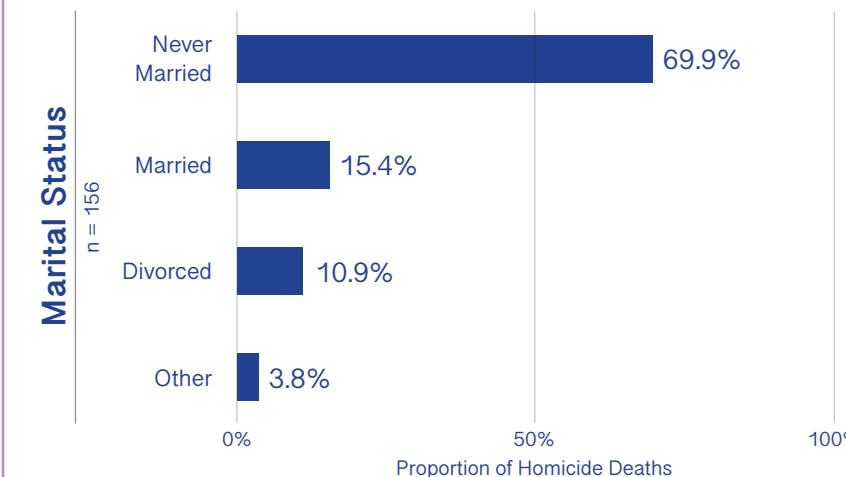


38.1% of total victims had an argument or conflict that led to the victim's death.

38.1% of total homicide deaths were related to conflict between intimate partners.
