***Information about each facility follows below.

Care Corps, Inc., located in Fremont, starts new construction this spring. The new facility will replace an old motel structure opened as an emergency shelter over 10 years ago. In the past seven years, Care Corps has seen an 83 percent increase in the number of people served. In 2004, assistance was provided to almost 800 homeless people. More than 200 adults and children had to be turned away in the past six months because the facility was at full capacity. The new facility will increase capacity and serve an additional 225 people per year.

People's City Mission, located in Lincoln, is undergoing an extensive expansion of its shelter facility, which will increase capacity to serve additional people in the emergency shelter, transitional housing and day center programs. This award will assist the agency in costs related to the heating and cooling system.

Dawson County Parent-Child Center, located in Lexington, assists victims of domestic violence in two counties and nine communities. This award allows the agency to make energy upgrades to its furnace and air conditioning system and to side and shingle the facility, which was built in 1977 and that they have occupied since 1990.

DOVES, located in Gering, is a domestic violence agency that serves five counties in the southern and central Panhandle. This award allows the agency to increase the energy efficiency of its heating and air conditioning system, to improve security in its shelter, and address drainage issues on its property that affect the shelter facility.

Rape/Domestic Abuse, located in North Platte, is a domestic violence agency. This award allows the agency to make its first floor bathroom handicap accessible, so they can serve an underserved population. Additionally, the agency will replace siding on the facility, which was purchased in 2005. Prior to 2005, the agency was located in a smaller facility.

Catholic Charities – Omaha, will use this award to significantly upgrade a shelter's food service area. The rehab will bring the area up to current codes and safety regulations and increase the usage of the kitchen and food service area.

Cedars Youth Services in Lincoln provides emergency shelter to troubled and runaway children. This award allows the agency to repair its exterior wheelchair ramp, repair exterior concrete steps and porch of the facility, upgrade two restrooms, and make repairs to the concrete basement floor.

Catholic Charities – Hastings, will increase food pantry space by 112 percent to better serve individuals and families in its transitional housing and family support services programs. The expansion also relocates the food pantry and increases easy access distribution of the agency's sack lunch program. Additionally, increased refrigeration capacity will allow the agency to accept larger donations of frozen food items.

Fresh Start Home located in Lincoln helps women who are homeless stabilize their lives and transition to permanent housing. Fresh Start is relocating to a facility in the Havelock neighborhood and is in the process of rehabilitating that facility. The new facility will increase capacity to serve women by 25 to 50 percent. Current space accommodates 16 women. The new location also provides services and employment within walking distance.

Nebraska Management Information System Partnership is a newly formed, statewide, non-profit organization whose purpose is to gather data about who is homeless or at-risk of becoming homeless in Nebraska. The data will help organizations better understand the characteristics of people who are homeless and direct resources where needed.
