I am writing this letter in support of LB 434. This bill allows Nebraska's courts to utilize videoconference systems in juvenile hearings.

At the present time, the determination whether a hearing can be held by videoconference is only with the agreement of all parties. This legislation would give judges more liberty to allow videoconference hearings. This change would result in decreased cost in travel, saving the time of respective parties and greater convenience for youth and families. Currently, both Youth Rehabilitation and Treatment Centers in Kearney and Geneva have videoconferencing capabilities and utilize them with great success.
