RE: Maternity Related Services for Refugee Medical Assistance Participants

This Health Plan Advisory is being issued to provide guidance to the Heritage Health plans regarding coverage of maternity-related services for members participating in the Refugee Medical Assistance (RMA) program.

Beginning July 1, 2019, new participants in the RMA program will be enrolled in a Heritage Health managed care plan. RMA participants are included in the RMA capitation payment cohort.

RMA program participants who become pregnant during their participation in the RMA program will be evaluated by Medicaid for eligibility under the Pregnant Women criteria. Heritage Health plans will be reimbursed for that member under the Pregnant Women category of aid.

If a Heritage Health plan becomes aware of an instance in which an RMA participant becomes pregnant, the health plan should notify Plan Management and work with the state and the member to help the member apply for Medicaid as a pregnant woman.

This guidance document is advisory in nature but is binding on an agency until amended by such agency. A guidance document does not include internal procedural documents that only affect the internal operations of the agency and does not impose additional requirements or penalties on regulated parties or include confidential information or rules and regulations made in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act. If you believe that this guidance document imposes additional requirements or penalties on regulated parties, you may request a review of the document.

In the event a Heritage Health plan receives claims for maternity-related services for an RMA member, and assuming the claims were submitted correctly, the health plan should pay those claims and notify Medicaid of the occurrence. Medicaid will work with the health plan to correct the member's eligibility category and ensure the health plan is appropriately reimbursed for the correct category of aid.
