The Statewide Elder Rights Coalition was formed in 1997 to promote elder rights advocacy, coordinate the Older Americans Act programs under Title IIIB Legal Services; and Title VII Prevention of Elder Abuse, Neglect and Financial Exploitation. The coalition meets on the second Wednesday of the month following the end of the quarter in January, April, July and October.

Accomplishments

- Developed the annual Elder Justice Training agenda. The annual training features topics such as consumer protection from fraud and scams, guardianship issues, advance directives, etc. The statewide training is free and is held in Lincoln and streamed live from the Nebraska education television, NET, with over 300 participants nationwide attending the training.  - d. Two 30-minute Television programs.
 - e. Television Public Service Announcements.
