STATUTORY AUTHORITY:

• N.R.S. 71-2601 through 71-2611 (Revised July 1, 2007).

MEMBERSHIP and **MEETINGS**:

- 17 members appointed by the Governor for five year terms. One new member, Dr. Jeromy Warner, was appointed in September 2012 due to the resignation of Dr. Bizell.
- Officers are appointed annually in November: Chair Dale Michels, MD; Vice Chair Daryl Wills, DC; and Secretary Paul Salansky, OD.
- Meetings are held the third Monday of odd months, except fourth Monday in January.
- September 2012 the Board met in Holdrege as guests of Phelps Memorial Health Center. As a cost saving measure, the May and July meetings were consolidated into one meeting held in June.
- 2013 meeting dates: January 28, March 18, June 17, September 16, and November 18.

PROFESSIONAL BOARD APPOINTMENTS:

• In 2012 there were 85 applicants; 35 interviews conducted; and 20 members appointed to 12 different professional boards and the Nebraska Center for Nursing.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

CREDENTIALING REVIEWS:

• Conducted 4 meetings for review of Music Therapists, until they withdrew their application. Started a review on Nurse Practitioners. Several reviews for 2013.

- Researched initiatives to develop position statements and prepare news articles.
- Received regular presentations by Bryson Bartels, DHHS Legislative Liaison.
- Received presentation by Carmen DeMare, DNP, APRN-NP on nurse-led interdisciplinary collaboration and her Quality Improvement Project at Creighton.
- Received presentation from Two Rivers Department of Health and Wellness.
- Issued press release during Public Health Month. Recognized Ted E. Bear Hollow.

REVIEW PANEL:

• There is an ad hoc committee to address the potential removal of professional board members for cause, in accordance with 184 NAC Ch. 6. The last member was removed for cause in 2010. The Review Panel opened a new investigation in November 2012.

Chair's Report Nebraska State Board of Health - 2012 Gary Westerman, D.D.S.

In 2012, members of the Board of Health (BOH), representing a variety of health care providers and the public, continued to serve the citizens of Nebraska by providing expertise and advice on health issues to the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS). The Board's vision, "healthy people in a healthy Nebraska", has guided our mission as we promote and protect the health and safety of Nebraska citizens in the following areas:

• Regulatory and legislative issues

- The Rules and Regulations Committee reviews regulations that are slated for either approval or review by the BOH. The committee has been working to streamline the review process to improve the efficiency of the BOH regulation discussions. There is a lot of work underway to meet the requirements for new and revised regulations due to the Uniform Credentialing Act.
- o The Credentialing Review Committee, which reviews credentialing or scope of practice proposals, has been challenged this year by several impressive assignments.
- The Public Health, Education and Legislation (PHEL) Committee provides a forum for the discussion of legislative issues.
 - At most Board of Health meetings, a DHHS representative updates the members about legislative issues.
 - Members share their profession's views of legislative issues and work collectively to craft positions that the entire board can support.
- These Board of Health members testify in person or send letters of testimony on behalf of the Board of Health to convey our concerns on proposed legislation.
 This year Board of Health members testified or wrote letters about two introduced bills, while tracking an additional two introduced bills.

• Professional Boards

- The Professional Boards Committee has been working diligently to meet the goals established in January 2012.
- Each Board member serves as a liaison to specific professional boards and provides information to the rest of the committee and Board.
- We have refined a screening process for the professional board applications out of respect for the time of both the applicant and the Board of Health members.
- We processed 95% of the applications electronically, saving resources.

Educational health programs

- Besides providing a legislative discussion forum, the Public Health, Education and Legislation (PHEL) Committee offers a mechanism for ongoing board member development by scheduling presentations over topics related to public health assessment, policy development, and public health assurance.
- The PHEL committee recognizes public health programs and providers who offer exemplary service via the Community Public Health Recognition program. This year the Board recognized Ted E. Bear Hollow in Omaha. Their main purpose is to provide grief therapy to children.

- The Board of Health is very interested in helping educate the public about pertinent health issues that exist in this multi-faceted state.
- Public health assessment, policy development, and assurance
 - o Besides participating in the work of the standing committees, several members serve as members of an ad hoc Review Panel that investigates when an issue concerning a board arises. When presented to the Board of Health, the Review Panel becomes "prosecutors" and the rest of the BOH becomes "jurors".
 - The Board of Health is grateful to the DHHS staff members who continue to educate the members about the intricacies of public health.

• Communication/coordination

- O In January, the BOH invited key senators and legislative staff to a luncheon at the State Office Building. The exchange of information and collegiality at these luncheons continue to surpass expectations. We appreciate the opportunity to communicate with the senators about BOH concerns and to provide them with advice on health care issues.
- The BOH plans to continue to build communication bridges with professional boards and chairs. Several incumbent professional board members shared concerns about investigative timelines and decisions.

The people of Nebraska continue to be well served by the Board of Health. The Board continues to be committed to the citizens of Nebraska and, through its very dedicated members, continues to provide dedicated service to the citizens of this state. In addition, the DHHS staff continues to provide excellent seasoned support to make this possible, and we all applaud and thank them for their service.

Looking ahead to 2013, we are poised to help with any challenges surrounding the changing landscape of national health care reform and the economy. Both are poised to change the lives and livelihoods of all Nebraskans. We are committed to our role as advocates for the public, while also being good stewards of state resources. There are several Credentialing Reviews on the slate for 2013. Efforts are always under way to create better communications throughout the DHHS. It is inspiring to see the passion that exudes from the various individuals on the Board of Health as they serve their fellow Nebraskans. These professionals ultimately sacrifice time pleasure and comforts in an attempt to provide timely high quality advice and guidance to the DHHS and ultimately the citizens of Nebraska. Rules and Regulations Committee

Goals for 2013

The Rules and Regulations Committee will continue to consider all regulations of the DHHS Division of Public Health prior to their presentation to the Board of Health.

This will include consideration for approval of additional professional and occupational credentialing regulations under the Uniform Credentialing Act (UCA). Of the total 64 chapters of UCA regulations, 22 are complete and 42 remain. Of those 42, drafting is complete for about half and is underway for the other half. The committee will be provided with an updated status report on the UCA regulations at each meeting.

Other Licensure Unit regulations to be considered in 2013 will include new regulations for the Credentialing Review Program. LB 834 (2012) amended the Regulation of Health Professions Act and new regulations are being developed to set out standards for use by review bodies in recommending whether proposals for credentialing or a change in scope of practice meet the statutory guidelines.

The Committee will also continue to review all other regulations of the Division of Public Health. This will include regulations of the Environmental Health, Lifespan Health Services, and Public Health Support Units.

From the Environmental Health Unit, three chapters of Public Water System regulations are being developed in response to new federal Environmental Protection Agency requirements. From the Public Health Support Unit, new regulations are being developed under LB 591 (2011), which established requirements for public health syndromic surveillance and for the sharing of immunization information.

Formalize and continue the process of inviting professional board chairpersons to meet with the Committee and discuss how their board functions and any concerns or issues they have that the Board of Health might address. Increase the number of board members maintaining contact with the assigned professional boards to enhance communication and clarify BOH members function at professional board meetings. Discuss possibilities for consolidation or mergers of boards.
- 1. Utilize the prescreening process again to make the best use of our interview times. If the Board of Health conducts a regular meeting in 2012 outside of Lincoln, interviews may also be offered at this location on the previous day for the convenience of applicants. The prescreening process will

be continue to be evaluated and revised as necessary. There are 12 scheduled professional board vacancies in 2012, and three vacancies on the Nebraska Center for Nursing for which terms are recommended to the Governor by the Board of Health.

- 2. Continue to work with professional organizations to increase the pool of qualified applicants for positions.
- 3. Utilize the peer evaluation process for incumbents for the 2012 interviews and develop a method of obtaining feedback from board members and staff about the process.
- 4. Continue to build and utilize the data base of professional board applicants who were excellent candidates, but for various reasons were not appointed to the positions they were seeking. Continue to develop and use protocol for notification, content of the letter or to be handled on an individual basis based upon the Professional Board recommendations. These applicants should receive consideration for the Credentialing Review Pool or PREP.
- 5. Further define the role of the committee in mediating issues with professional board members.
- 6. Develop guidelines for the appointment of individuals who wish to serve concurrently on more than one Professional Board.

Committee Duties and Responsibilities:

The Public Health, Education, and Legislation (PHEL) Committee met in person five times and via conference call once during 2012 and worked toward the following committee objective: To identify and promote public education and legislation to enhance the health, mental health, and living environment of all residents of Nebraska.

Committee Objectives for 2012:

- ✓ Provide information and education about selected health programs in Nebraska that promote public health and the prevention of health and behavioral health problems.
- ✓ Develop BOH position statements directed toward public health issues that affect Nebraskans.
- ✓ Review, select, prioritize and advocate for proposed legislation that enhances health of Nebraskan's citizens.
- ✓ Advocate and support legislative efforts to enhance opportunities for the education and development of health care professionals in Nebraska, especially in underserved areas.
- ✓ Help plan retreats and provide program content for special meetings of the Board of Health.
- ✓ Promote cooperative efforts with district health departments and other public health entities
- ✓ Honor those public health programs that have worked to improve the lives of Nebraskans

Activities in 2012:

January:

Dr. Hopp, Chair of the Public Health, Education and Legislation Committee, listed bills of interest to his committee, as determined during a committee conference call held on January 20, 2012, and committee discussion held the morning of January 24th. Conference call participants included Dr. Hopp, Dr. Kester, Dr. Evans, Ms. Jackson and staff Monica Gissler.

Dr. Hopp explained the three categories that the Board of Health places legislative bill in: Category 1: Take action on; 2: Monitor and take possible action on, and 3: monitor.

Board of Health support means providing testimony or sending a letter stating any concerns. For each of the support and opposition bills listed above, the Board will send a letter and/or testify.

March:

The Committee reviewed their priority bills for this session. LB 831 on Genetic Counseling was signed by the Governor and we had supported it. LB 721 Certified Nurse Midwifery is still in Committee, and we sent a letter recommending they refer to the 407 report.

Public Health Recognition for Ted E Bear Hollow, submitted by Monica Gissler on behalf of the PHEL Committee.

Ted E. Bear Hollow is a nonprofit organization that provides day camps, support groups and other services for grieving children, teens and their families. Founded in 2001, the center has helped more than 5,000 metro-area families by giving them support, understanding and the skills to communicate and cope after the death of a loved one.

Their work is paid for by members and contributors, and families are never charged. The staff and volunteers at Ted E. Bear Hollow are a community resource. They offer information and training to groups and organizations that are dealing with child grief, or would like to know more about the subject. Their website is http://www.tedebearhollow.org/index.php.

June:

Carman DeMare, DNP, MSN, APRN-NP presented to the full Board of Health earlier in the day regarding nurse-led interdisciplinary collaboration and her Quality Improvement Project at Creighton University School of Nursing: "Active surveillance and referral program to ensure respiratory synctial virus (RSV) prophylaxis for the pediatric congenital heart disease (CHD) population." She provided handouts of her presentation, but highlights included:

- Monthly injection (Synagis) that can prevent RSV.
- There is no formal policy or process for the identification and referral of CHD patients eligible for the RSV prophylaxis.
- Children's electronic medical record (EMR).
- PDSA Plan, Do, Study, Act

September:

Legislative Luncheon – To be held on January 28, 2013 at the Nebraska Bar Foundation. New senators elected in November will be invited, regardless of committee assignment. Same format.

The PHEL Committee tentatively set the date to screen legislative bills via conference call on January 25. The Legislative calendar has not been set yet, so this could change.

There could be an APRN bill to remove collaborative agreements with physicians, and maybe a bill from the dental hygienists.

The Committee discussed a request from the Office of Congressman Fortenberry, asking for the opinion of the State Board of Health regarding H.R. 6107 on the Veterans E-Health & Telemedicine Support Act of 2012. Per a website (http://www.healthcareitnews.com/news/vets-act-seeks-increase-access-telemedicine-veterans) description: The Veterans E-Health & Telemedicine Support (VETS) Act of 2012 would enable providers affiliated with the Department of Veterans Affairs to deliver telemedicine services across state lines, eliminating a requirement that the providers be licensed in the same state as their patients. H.R. 6107 follows several recent moves by the federal government to adopt telemedicine as a means of treating service members, veterans and their families. So far this year, the VA has dropped co-payments charged to veterans for telehealth consultations and is setting a goal of providing 200,000 remote consultations by the end of this year (up from 140,000 last year).

Some Medical Boards are concerned that the bill's broad language may yield unintended consequences for the quality and safety of care provided to veterans. According to the Medical Board Association: "By expanding the state licensure exemption to the extent that the provider would not necessarily be licensed in either the jurisdiction where the telemedicine services originate or where the patient is located removes sufficient regulatory oversight and adequate recourse for the patient in the event of harm."

It was agreed to send the following response to Congressman Fortenberry: Based on the information we have available to us today, the Nebraska State Board of Health has no objection to H.R. 6107.

November:

Members reviewed the special legislative session in progress. There will be a PHEL conference call on January 24 or 25, 2013 to discuss introduced bills. The legislative luncheon for January 28th was also discussed.

Committee Objectives for 2013:

Continue the work from 2012. There are many deserving public health programs taking place across the state. We would like to recognize more of these programs and share the news of their good work.
