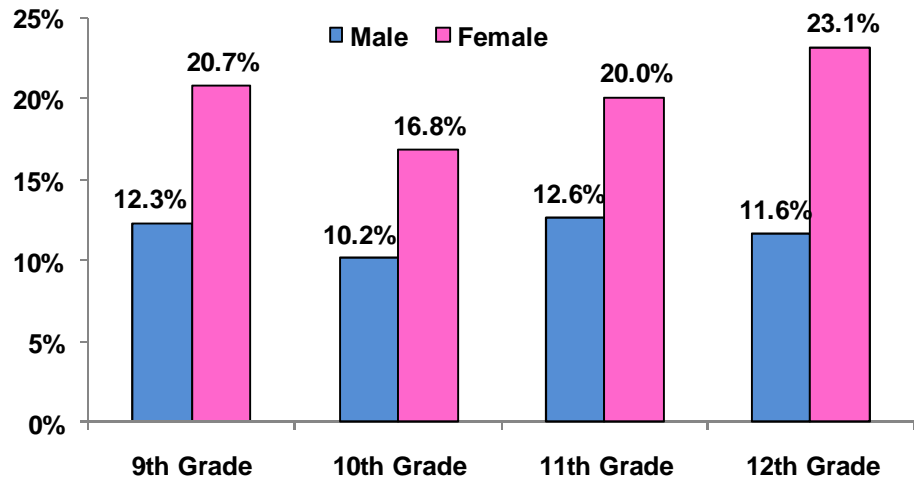


Bullying behaviors among Nebraska adolescents, 2010

2010 Nebraska Youth Risk Behavior Survey Quick Facts:

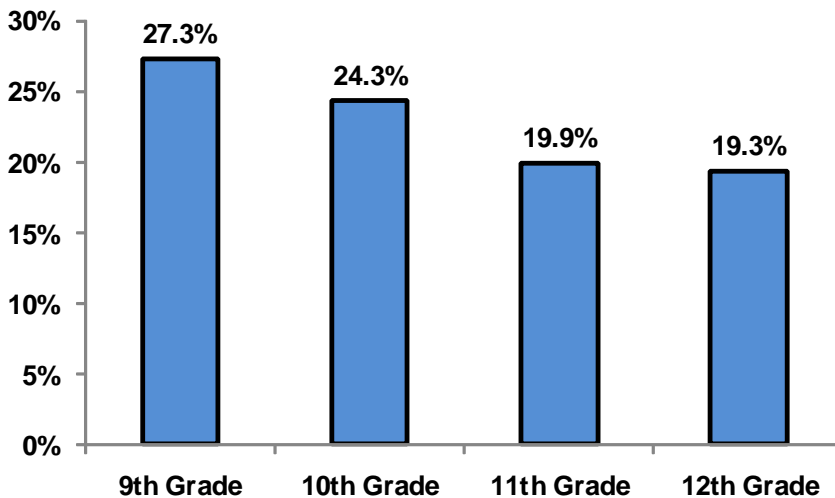
- Female students were almost twice as likely to be electronically bullied compared to male students in 9th-12th grades (20.1% vs. 11.8%).
- About 1 in 4 students in 9th and 10th grades and 1 in 5 students in 11th and 12th grades reported being bullied on school property during the past 12 months.

Bullying is a form of youth violence.

Bullying includes:

- Attack or intimidation with the intention to cause fear, or harm that is either physical, verbal, or psychological.
- A real or perceived imbalance of power between the bully and the victim.
- Repeated attacks/intimidation between children over time.

Bullying can result in physical injury, social and emotional distress, and even death.
