
Key Facts: Minority Population Growth

## Percent Distribution of Nebraska Population by Race/Ethnicity 2014

In 2014, Nebraska's total population is 1,881,503, Nebraska's total minority population represented 19.5% of the total Nebraska Population. The Hispanic population remains the largest minority group in Nebraska. The African American population is the second largest minority group in the state followed by Asian, American Indian, and Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islanders.



## Nebraska Population Changes by Race/Ethnicity 2010-2014

From 2010 to 2014, Nebraska's total population increased by 3%. The total minority population grew by 13%. The largest minority population change was the Asian (NH) population, which grew by 24%. The population changes for the NHPI (NH) and Hispanic populations were similar—both approximately 14%. African Americans and American Indians had the lowest percent changes of the minority groups (6.6% and 4.1%, respectively). The population change among the non-Hispanic White population was 0.8%.
