
The **Contract** between the parties dated July 1, 2013 is hereby amended as follows:





Service	Parenting Skill Development and Visitation
Definition	<p>Parenting Skill Development – during visits between a child/youth and parent, trained staff shall teach, coach, and role model appropriate parenting skills and activities. This applies to all types of visitation listed below.</p> <p>Supervised Visitation – visits between a child/youth and parent which require line of site supervision and in proximity to hear the interactions of the visit by a trained staff who will intervene if child safety is compromised.</p> <p>Semi-Supervised Visitation – visits between a child/youth and parent which requires monitoring of the visit by trained staff who will intervene if child safety is compromised. This monitoring will vary based on the length of the visit and the individual visitation plan developed with the family.</p> <p>Drop-ins – provides for a trained staff person to check in on the family unannounced to assess for safety of a child/youth and intervene if child safety is compromised.</p>
Target Population	This service is available to any family who is working with DHHS.
Length of Service	As long as a safety threat exists.
Staff Credentials	Agency staff providing parenting skill development and any level of visitation supervision shall have a minimum of a Bachelor's Degree in Human Services preferred or related field. Exceptions can be granted by the Service Area Administrator.
Established Rate	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. DHHS shall pay the Contractor \$47.00 per hour for direct, (face to face) contact time with the youth and family utilizing Parenting Skills Services. 2. Pre-approval by DHHS must be obtained if more than one staff will be needed to work with a larger family. 3. DHHS shall pay the Contractor \$25.00 per hour for travel from the provider's home or office, whichever is closest in proximity to the client. 4. DHHS shall pay the Contractor for partial hours according to the following schedule: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) 0-15 minutes - .25 hour b) 16-30 minutes - .50 hour c) 31-45 minutes - .75 hour d) 46-60 minutes – 1.00 hour
