

TRANSITIONAL LIVING ATTACHMENT

Service	Transitional Living
Definition	Transitional Living – designed to provide youth housing in an independent living setting e.g. apartment, house. Trained staff will mentor, coach, and provide guidance to youth who are expected to graduate from foster care. Designed to enhance the youth’s independent living skills. Areas of focus should include assisting youth with education, vocational skills, household maintenance, and gaining knowledge of community services and other supportive resources available and how to access them.
Target Population	Youth 16 to 18 years of age working with DHHS.
Length of Service	3 to 6 months
Established Rate	DHHS shall pay: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • \$50.00 per day per youth for Level 1, • \$60.00 per day per youth for Level 2, and • \$70.00 per day per youth for Level 3. • \$39.00 per hour of direct life skills instruction Levels are determined by assessments conducted by transitional living staff and approved by DHHS
