

CFS Outcome Measures for In-Home/Safety Services

Safety Outcomes:

1. Children are first and foremost protected from abuse and neglect.
 - Repeat maltreatment
2. Children are safely maintained in their own homes when possible and appropriate.
 - Services to family to protect child(ren) in home and prevent removal.
 - Risk of harm to child

Permanency Outcomes:

1. Children have permanency and stability in their living situations.
 - Foster care re-entries
 - Stability of foster care placement
 - Permanency goal for child
 - Reunification
2. The continuity of family relationships and connections is preserved.
 - Proximity of foster care placement
 - Placement with siblings
 - Visiting with parents and siblings in foster care
 - Preserving connections
 - Relative placement
 - Relationship of child in care with parents.

Well Being Outcomes:

1. Families have enhanced capacity to provide for children's needs.
 - Need and services of child, parents, foster parents
 - Child and family involvement in case planning.
2. Children receive services to meet their educational needs.
 - Educational needs of the child
3. Children receive services to meet their physical and mental health needs.
 - Physical health of the child
 - Mental health of the child

Community Safety Outcome:

- Communities are free from law violations committed by juveniles ages 0 -18 years old. As evidenced by:
- Increased youth engagement in Positive Youth Development activities.
 - Reduced Recidivism.
