

## **When does a worker place an EF Program Case in transitional status?**

Eligibility for transitional EF supportive services has nothing to do with the eligibility for TMA-G, TMA or TCC. It is based on their eligibility for transitional (up to 6 months) or extended (up to 3 months) EF supportive services as found at 2-020.08A and 468-000-309, page 3 "Supportive Services Following Ineligibility for a Grant". The effective date of this status would be the first of the month after the loss of eligibility for ADC due to earned income.

### Transitional EF Supportive Services

Once the family loses eligibility for ADC cash assistance due to the individual's earned income and:

- S/he was either cooperating with EF or participating in EF at the time.
- The EF case manager may provide him/her with up to six months, if needed, of supportive services that are necessary for the individual to be able to keep their current job.
- The supportive service must be determined as necessary and critical for the individual to be able to maintain and retain his/her current employment.

### Extended EF Supportive Services

Once the family loses eligibility for ADC cash assistance due to the individual's earned income and:

- The participant was participating in EF at the time.
- The EF case manager may provide him/her with necessary supportive services for up to three months, if needed, for all approved EF activities that were included in his/her Service Plan at the time the family lost eligibility for ADC due to his/her earned income.
