



Nebraska Population Projections Age 85+ 2000-2030


Nebraska Population Projections Age 65+ 2000-2030

NEBRASKA FACT SHEET

Medicaid:

- ⇒ In FY03, Nebraska ranked 27th in the percent of it's state budget spent on Medicaid (18.9%; all states = 21.4%). In FY04, Nebraska is expected to drop to 38th (17.2%; states = 21.9%)

- ⇒ In FY03, Nebraska ranked 29th in per capita Medicaid expenditures (\$78; all states = \$92)

- ⇒ In 2005, Nebraska ranks 28th in the Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP) – the federal matching percentage for Medicaid (59.64% for Medicaid; 71.75% for SCHIP), returning \$1.48 and \$2.54 for each State dollar spent for Medicaid and SCHIP, respectively.

- ⇒ In 1998, the latest year for which these data are available, Nebraska ranked 27th in Medicaid expenditures as a percent of total personal health care expenditures (14.4%; all states = 15.7%)

- ⇒ In FFY2000, Nebraska ranked 27th in Medicaid spending per enrollee (\$3,768; all states = 3,762; range: \$2,068 - \$7,609)
- ⇒ Nebraska ranked 47th in the percent change in the number of retail prescriptions filled from 2002 to 2003 (-7.1%; all states = +1.5%)
- ⇒ In 2003, Nebraska ranked 24th in the number of retail prescriptions filled per capita (10.8; all states = 10.7)
- ⇒ In 2000, Nebraska ranked 21st in state health care expenditures as a percent of the Gross State Product (3.0%)

- ⇒ In FY2002, Nebraska ranked 38th in state mental health agency expenditures per capita (\$55.56)

NEBRASKA FACT SHEET

Demographic:

- ⇒ In 2000, 2.0% of Nebraska's population was 85 years of age or older, compared to 1.5% nationally. The 85+ population in Nebraska is projected to increase 52.5% from 2005 to 2030.
- ⇒ In 2000, 13.6% of Nebraska's population was 65 years of age or older, compared to 12.4% nationally. Between 2005 and 2030, the 65+ population is projected to increase by 75.2%.
- ⇒ In 2000, 26.3% of Nebraska's population was under 18 years of age, compared to 25.7% Nationally. By 2030, the under 18 population is projected to increase 14.3%.

Health Status:

- ⇒ In 2002, Nebraska ranked 11th in the number of births per 1,000 population (14.7; all states = 13.9)

Nebraska's birth rate was higher than the national average for all racial/ ethnic groups:

- ⇒ In 2002, Nebraska ranked 31st in the percent of mothers beginning prenatal care in the first trimester (83.4%; all states = 83.7%)
- ⇒ In 2002, Nebraska ranked 5th in the number of occupational fatalities per 100,000 workers (9.5; all states = 4.3)

- ⇒ In 2002, Nebraska ranked 19th in the percent of the population considered overweight or obese (57%; all states = 56%)
- ⇒ In 2001, Nebraska ranked 6th in the percent of adults who report no physical activity (31%; all states = 26%)

Economic:

- ⇒ In 2003, Nebraska ranked 13th in the proportion of persons aged 65+ living below the poverty level (10.8%; all states = 10.2%)

⇒ Nebraska ranked 15th in the percent of persons under 65 years of age without health insurance coverage (11.3%; all states = 15.6%)
