RE: Eligibility Determination by Caseworkers for Labor and Delivery Services for
Illegal Aliens

PLEASE SHARE THIS INFORMATION WITH ADMINISTRATIVE, CLINICAL
AND BILLING STAFF.

Effective immediately, DHHS caseworkers will be able to approve emergency labor and delivery services only. Other emergency services will still need to be processed by the State Review Team. Providers will need to furnish a hospital discharge summary that would document the date of admission, the date of discharge, the type of delivery, and the date of delivery.

Illegal aliens requesting Medicaid coverage for medical emergencies must meet Medicaid eligibility requirements, other than citizenship. In addition, the medical services must meet the federal definition of "emergency services". Medicaid eligibility will not be authorized until after the emergency service has occurred.

The definition of an emergency medical service includes a vaginal or cesarean delivery, but does not include routine prenatal and postpartum care. The only procedure codes covered are 59409 for a vaginal delivery or 59514 for a cesarean delivery. Global codes that include prenatal and/or postpartum care not emergency services and should not be billed to Medicaid.

Sterilizations do not meet the definition of "emergency services" and are not reimbursable for illegal aliens.

Services for a vaginal or cesarean delivery should be billed using the Medicaid identification number issued to the mother for coverage of emergency services. Services for the mother should not be billed using the Medicaid identification number for the newborn. Billing with the incorrect Medicaid identification number will result in denial of the claim.
