RE: Seasonal Influenza Vaccine Update

Please share this information with administrative clinical, and billing staff.

This provider bulletin replaces previous bulletins regarding seasonal influenza vaccine updates. The purpose of the provider bulletin is to clarify the coverage of influenza vaccine for Medicaid fee-for-service eligible clients. Seasonal influenza vaccine is covered for all Nebraska Medicaid clients following the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) recommendations for children and adults.

Coverage Criteria:

- For clients who are 18 years old and younger, the vaccine is available through the Vaccines for Children (VFC) Program. Providers must be VFC enrolled to obtain the vaccine.
- Nebraska Medicaid only reimburses for administration of vaccines that are available for children through the VFC program.
- CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) have recommended that live attenuated influenza vaccine (LAIV; nasal spray) flu vaccine should not be used during the 2016-2017 flu season. Nebraska Medicaid will not cover the LAIV nasal flu vaccine.
- Administration of preservative-free vaccine will require medical necessity documentation with claim submission for adults or through the VFC program.
- Medicaid is unable to reimburse providers for private stock vaccine for children to age 18.
- In the physician office, providers will bill the vaccine CPT code with an SL modifier

which indicates a state-supplied vaccine. Claims billed for VFC eligible children without the SL modifier will be denied.

- VFC vaccine is not available at retail pharmacies at this time. Children will need to receive VFC vaccine from a VFC-enrolled provider.
- Pharmacies can bill the point of sale vendor for eligible clients 19 and older who are not Medicare eligible and may be administered to adult clients at pharmacies by an authorized Licensed Pharmacist.
- Influenza vaccine may be administered to homebound clients by home health care providers during a home visit.
