# HIV/AIDS RESOURCES

## 1. COUNSELING, TESTING AND REFERRAL SERVICES

### **Counseling, Testing and Referral – Partner Counseling and Referral Services (CTR-PCRS) Sites in Nebraska**

Both confidential (with name) and anonymous (without a name) testing are allowed at state-funded Counseling, Testing and Referral - Partner Counseling and Referral Services (CTR-PCRS) sites. Physicians ordering HIV testing in all other settings may offer confidential testing only but can refer patients to CTR-PCRS sites for anonymous testing at the patient's request.

"A person seeking a human immunodeficiency virus test shall have the right to remain anonymous. A health care provider shall confidentially refer such person to a site which provides anonymous testing." - *Nebraska Revised Statute 71-531, Section 3 - note exceptions*

Anonymous test results are not included in the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services *HIV/AIDS Morbidity/Mortality Report*. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) does not accept anonymous test results as cases.

The UNMC HIV Program provides comprehensive care of the HIV-infected patient in all stages of the disease. Consultation in virtually every medical and surgical specialty is available. Lab testing is done onsite at the UNMC laboratory. We accept many forms of insurance as well as Medicare and Medicaid. Patients in managed care insurance are urged to consult their primary care physicians for referral before making an appointment. The HIV Clinic is not an HIV testing facility. Individuals concerned about their HIV status and wishing to have an HIV test are encouraged to consult their physician or have anonymous testing performed at one of the many DHHS test sites. Patient confidentiality is respected at all times. UNMC also holds satellite HIV Clinics every three months in Grand Island and North Platte.

The program helps with the cost of health care, but it does not cover all medical expenses or the cost of most long-term care. Individuals apply for Medicare at their local Social Security Administration office.

Part A: Hospital insurance

Part B: Medical insurance

Part C: Medicare Advantage (formerly known as Medicare + Choice)

People with HIV/AIDS may qualify for disability benefits from the Social Security Administration under two programs:

### **SSDI – Social Security Disability Insurance**

SSDI are paid to individuals who have worked in the most recent years, usually 5 out of the last ten years.

### **SSI – Supplemental Security Income**

A Federal income supplement program for those people who have not worked enough to qualify for Social Security or whose Social Security benefits are low. It is designed to help aged, blind, and disabled people, who have little or no income and it provides cash to meet basic needs for food, clothing and shelter.

Only individuals who have a disability and meet medical criteria may qualify for benefits under either program.

### Medicaid

The Nebraska Medical Assistance Program, also known as the Medicaid Program, is a program that is jointly funded by the State and the federal governments to provide medical services to those who cannot afford to pay for medically necessary services. 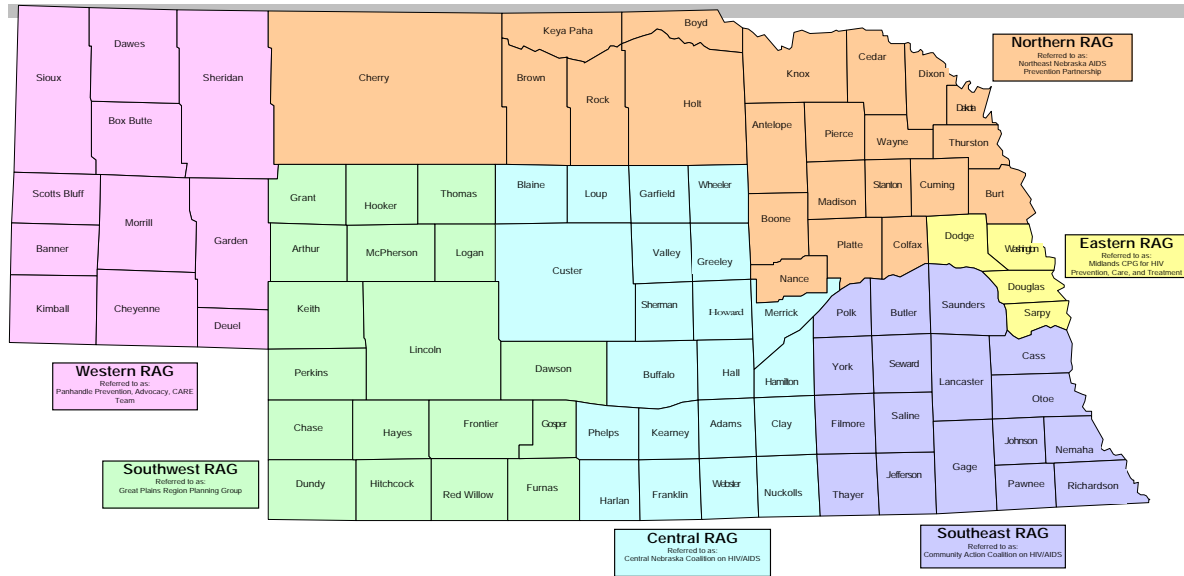
