

# Locations of Counseling, Testing & Referral - Partner Counseling and Referral Services (CTR-PCRS) Sites in Nebraska

Both confidential (with name) and anonymous testing (without a name) are allowed at state-funded Counseling, Testing and Referral - Partner Counseling and Referral Services (CTR-PCRS) sites. Physicians ordering HIV testing in all other settings may offer confidential testing only but can refer patients to CTR-PCRS sites for anonymous testing at the patient's request.

"A person seeking a human immunodeficiency virus test shall have the right to remain anonymous. A health care provider shall confidentially refer such person to a site which provides anonymous testing." - *Nebraska Revised Statute 71-531, Section 3 - note exceptions*

Anonymous test results are not included in the Nebraska Department of Health & Human Services *HIV/AIDS Morbidity/Mortality Report*. [Centers for Disease Control & Prevention \(CDC\)](http://www.cdc.gov) does not accept anonymous test results as cases.

### Testing Facts: Anonymous versus Confidential

Appointment by identifier number.	Appointment usually by number - may be by name if you prefer.
Your real name not required.	Name, address, birth date, telephone number kept confidentially as are all other medical records.
All HIV information kept in separate, locked files at this site.	All HIV related information kept in separate, locked files at this site.
Pretest consultation provided prior to test.	Pretest consultation provided prior to test.
Witnessed informed consent. A signature is required.	Witnessed informed consent. You sign your real name.
Blood specimen sent to state lab by number only.	Blood specimen sent to state lab by number only.
Results received in person only.	Results received in person only.
Post-test consultation provided.	Post-test consultation provided.
Partner notification offered to seropositive clients.	Partner notification offered to seropositive clients.
Positive report to Nebraska Health & Human Services (HHSS) by number only.	Positive report to Nebraska Health & Human Services (HHSS) by number, name, address, birth date and telephone number.
Positive report to Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) by number only.	Positive report to Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) by number only.
If positive, impossible to notify if appointment missed, or to offer services.	If positive, possible to notify if appointment missed, or to offer services.
Impossible to contact if problem with test result and retesting is necessary.	Possible to contact if problem with test result and retesting is necessary.
Possible to identify information regarding sex/needle sharing partners you are concerned about notifying.	Possible to identify information regarding sex/needle sharing partners you are concerned about notifying.
Information provided for services related to medical, mental health, support, etc., only at time of post-test counseling.	Information provided and referrals facilitated to services related to medical, mental health, support, etc., after post-test counseling.
