*People who are at increased risk of colon cancer because of family history or medical conditions should begin colon cancer screening before age 50. Ask your health care provider for more information or call 1-800-532-2227 to receive a colon cancer screening enrollment packet.

Get Screened.

Don't let your patients get behind.

Recommend colon cancer screening to all your patients 50 years of age and older.

The Nebraska Colon Cancer Screening Program is open to both men and women age 50 years and older with incomes at or below 225% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines (i.e. family of four can make up to \$46,463).
