

Regional Boards

The Regional Boards are ten member boards. There are four regions.
The Director of Public Health appoints these boards. The members serve for three-year terms.

Regional Board Constitution:

1. Regional Trauma Medical Director.
2. One Physician either an ER Physician or a Surgeon.
3. One Nurse (preference to the individual who works in the ER).
4. One Hospital Administrator.
5. One Emergency Medical Dispatcher.
6. One Mid-level Practitioner.
7. One Consumer.
8. One Rehabilitation Professional.
9. One Out-of-Hospital Provider.
10. One EMS Instructor.
11. *One Data Analyst.
12. *Regional Support Staff Member

* = Not a voting member

Regional Trauma System Advisory Board's Role:

- Advise the department regarding trauma care needs throughout the state.
- Advise the Board of Emergency Medical Services regarding trauma care provided by out-of-hospital services
- Review and recommend changes to the regional trauma plans
- Review and recommend changes to trauma systems statutes and regulations
- Attend regional performance improvement meetings (optional)
- Participate in statewide trauma committee meetings (optional)
- Review and comment on trauma registry data
