Advanced STD Update Course

January 14th

This full-day course will provide state-of-the-art training in the field of sexually transmitted diseases (STDs), with an emphasis on clinical diagnosis, treatment and prevention. Using evidence-based guidelines from the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the course will review current issues related to the epidemiology, clinical presentation, diagnostic strategies, and appropriate treatment regimens for syphilis, gonorrhea, chlamydia, and other STDs.

This course will be presented by **Dr. Bradley Stoner, MD, PhD**, Medical Director of the St. Louis STD/HIV Prevention Training Center Associate Professor of Anthropology and Medicine/Infectious Diseases Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis.
