

## Trauma Education

Courses that meet trauma-related continuing education include trauma specific courses approved by national or state accrediting agencies.

For R.N's, TNCC, ENPC, PALS and PEARS meet the trauma education requirements for trauma center designation. It is to your advantage to take TNCC, ENPC, PALS and PEARS to meet the requirements because the state has budgeted for reimbursement of these specific courses. Reimbursement must be requested to 30-days in advance through your Regional EMS Coordinator.

The following are other trauma-related topics that may be used in hourly increments to meet the 8 hours every 2 years of trauma education with 2 hours in pediatrics:

- Trauma to the Abdomen
- Emergency Trauma Assessment
- Head Trauma
- Emergency Burn Evaluation and Care
- Trauma in the Elderly
- Trauma of the Muscular and Skeletal Systems
- Trauma of the Eye
- Emergency Pediatric Trauma
- Syndromes of the Spinal Cord
- Emergency Stabilization and Transfer
- Orthopedic Spine
- Shock

\*Funds have not been budgeted at this time for continuing education topics in hourly increments or symposiums highlighted in blue.

If trauma education is incorporated as one or two topics in an eight hour class then "the hour" or whatever time-frame is designated for the topic must be documented for each nurse. Please provide documentation that provides the course taken, the instructor, and the number of hours provided for each nurse.

### **Other approved trauma related education includes:**

Trauma-related symposiums, e.g., Omaha Trauma System, BryanLGH Trauma Symposium, Norfolk Trauma Symposium, Midwest Trauma Society Symposium. Copies of these certificates should also be available the time of the re-designation visit.
