All pass rates are for first-time candidates taking the NCLEX practical nursing (PN) exam. Schools represented are those offering practical nursing (PN) programs. The NCLEX-PN national passing standard was raised April 1, 2014 from -0.27 to -0.21 logits. This new standard will remain in effect through March 31, 2017. A logit is a measurement to report relative differences between candidate ability estimates and item difficulties.

Data is based on aggregate results from National Council of State Boards of Nursing and may contain errors due to miscoding by candidates. Current pass rates should be obtained from the program directly.
