## NAICS 72



The Accommodation and Food Services sector includes establishments providing customers with lodging and/or preparing meals, snacks, and beverages for immediate consumption. The sector includes both accommodation and food services establishments because the two activities are often combined at the same establishment.



### Number of Injuries and Illnesses

In 2012, an estimated 1,700 total non-fatal injuries and illnesses occurred in Nebraska's private Accommodation and Food Services sector.

### Injury and Illness Facts

**390** non-fatal injuries and illnesses involved days away from work in 2012:


- 280 (72%) cases were women.
- Workers aged 25-34 made up 150 (38%) of cases.
- The median number of days away from work was 6 days.
- 30 (8%) cases were musculoskeletal disorders.
- 60 (15%) were sprains, strains, or tear injuries/illnesses.
- Wednesday was the most frequent day of week for an injury/illness.

### Rate of Injuries and Illnesses

In 2012, the estimated non-fatal injury/illness rate in Nebraska's private Accommodation and Food Services sector was 4.2 per 100 full-time workers, which was higher than the U.S. rate of 3.8 per 100 full-time workers.
