

# Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting

## NAICS 11




The Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in growing crops, raising animals, harvesting timber, and harvesting fish and other animals from a farm, ranch, or their natural habitats. The establishments in this sector are often described as farms, ranches, dairies, greenhouses, nurseries, orchards, or hatcheries. A farm may consist of a single tract of land or a number of separate tracts which may be held under different tenures.

### Number of Injuries and Illnesses

In 2012, an estimated 500 total non-fatal injuries and illnesses occurred in Nebraska's private agriculture, forestry, fishing, and hunting industry sector.

Annual number of injuries and illnesses in agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting, Nebraska, 2008–2012



### Rate of Injuries and Illnesses

In 2012, the estimated non-fatal injury/illness rate in Nebraska's private agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting sector was 6.2 per 100 full-time workers, which was higher than the U.S. rate of 5.5 per 100 full-time workers.

### Fatal Injury Facts

Out of 13 fatal work injuries among workers in the agriculture, forestry, fishing, and hunting industry 2012:

- 11 (85%) fatalities were men.
- 9 (69%) were self-employed workers.
- Vehicles were a primary source of injury in 7 (54%) fatalities, and machinery was a primary source of injury in 4 (31%) fatalities.
- 10 (77%) deaths occurred on a farm.
- 9 (69%) were among workers with management occupations.
