
Industries in the hospitals subsector provide medical, diagnostic, and treatment services that include physician, nursing, other health services, and specialized accommodation services required by patients. Establishments provide inpatient health services, many of which can only be provided using the specialized facilities and equipment that form a significant and integral part of the production process. Hospitals may also provide outpatient services as a secondary activity.

Number of Injuries and Illnesses

In 2012, an estimated 1,800 total non-fatal injuries and illnesses occurred in Nebraska's private Hospitals subsector.

Annual number of non-fatal injuries and illnesses in hospitals, Nebraska, 2008–2012



Rate of Injuries and Illnesses

In 2012, the estimated non-fatal injury/illness rate in Nebraska's private Hospitals subsector was 7.0 per 100 full-time workers, which was higher than the average Nebraska private industry rate of 3.9 per 100 full-time workers.

Injury and Illness Facts

Out of 340 non-fatal injuries and illnesses involving days away from work in 2012:

- 85% of injury/illness cases were women.
- Workers aged 25-34 made up 24% of cases.
- The median number of days away from work was 2.4 days.
- 56% were musculoskeletal disorders.
- 59% were overexertion and bodily reaction events.
- 53% were sprains, strains, or tear injuries/illnesses.
- Healthcare patients were the source of injury/illness in 38% of cases.
