Setting	Outpatient services are provided in an office, clinic, home or other environment appropriate to the provision of psychotherapy or substance use services.
License	License as required by DHHS Division of Public Health.
Basic Definition	 Supervision by the supervising practitioner is the critical oversight of a treatment activity and directing the Medicaid eligible individual care. This includes, but is not limited to, the following: review of treatment plan and progress notes specific case discussion, and annual face to face assessment of the individual. The critical involvement of the supervising practitioner is to be reflected in the Initial Diagnostic Interview, the treatment plan, and the interventions provided.
Service Expectations (basic expectations for more detail see Title 471 chapters 20 & 32	 Provide face-to-face service to the Medicaid eligible individual annually or as often as medically necessary. Direct patient care by reviewing and approving individual treatment plan and progress notes. Provide the therapist with recommendations for medically necessary treatment and assure the treatment meets standards of care. The supervising practitioner shall be available in person or by telephone to provide assistance as needed during the time services are being provided.
Staffing	Psychologist or an LIMHP who provides supervision to a non-independently licensed clinician.
Staffing Ratio	The supervising practitioner and the Medicaid eligible individual with consequent follow up with a clinician.
Desired Individual Outcome	Assurance that the individual specific treatment plan is accurate and up to date as evidenced through a face to face interview with the individual and a review of the interventions provided by the treating practitioner.
