#### INTRODUCTION

The Child Abuse and Neglect Report (CAN) provides information from the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services – Division of Children and Family Services on reports of child abuse or neglect and their disposition. The Division of Children and Family Services (CFS) is responsible for receiving these reports and works with Law Enforcement when responding to them.

#### **DATA SOURCE**

The data presented in the following tables and charts represent the information entered in the N-Focus (Nebraska Family Online Client User System) information system. The data is extracted annually.

Data provided in this report represent Calendar Year (CY) data.

The Calendar Year 2022 (CY 2022) data was extracted on June 23, 2023. The previous years' data were extracted on the following dates:


The Service Area maps in this report reflect changes in the Service Areas resulting from 2018 legislation (LB 821) effective July 1, 2018.

### **SECTION 1: INTAKE REPORTS**

The charts above represent the reports related to child abuse received by the Department of Health and Human Services during Calendar Year 2022. There were a total of 36,756 reports categorized as follows:

- Child Abuse or Neglect Reports: 30,852 (84%)
  Reports with Multiple Allegations: 2,968(8%)
- No Allegation Reports: 2,936 (8%)


The pie chart on the right further categorizes the Child Abuse/Neglect reports and groups them as either Accepted or Screened Out. Screened Out reports did not meet the level of severity or definition of Child Abuse and Neglect that required assessment by a Children and Family Services Specialist.

- Screened Out: 19,986 (54%)
  - 10,552 (53%) Neglect
  - 6,433 (32%) Abuse
  - 1,282 (6%) Both Abuse and Neglect
  - 1,719 (9%) No Allegation Reports
- Accepted Reports: 16,770 (46%)
  - 9,237 (55%) Neglect
  - 4,630 (27%) Abuse
  - 1,686 (10%) Both Abuse and Neglect
  - 1,217 (7%) No Allegation Reports

#### **Glossary of Terms**

**Assessed:** This term is used to describe reports of child abuse/neglect or dependent children that are accepted for assessment/investigation by the Department or referred to Law Enforcement for investigation.

**Alternative Response:** A term used to identify reports with families with less severe reports of child abuse and/or neglect that are accepted for assessment. These reports do not focus on an abuse/neglect investigation, but instead focus on connecting families with supports and services needed to enhance the ability to keep children safe and healthy.

**Child Abuse/Neglect:** Maltreatment occurs when a child from birth through age 17 is physically, emotionally, or sexually harmed.

#### Abuse:

- ❖ Physical: Information indicates the existence of an injury that is unexplained; not consistent with the explanation given; or is non-accidental. The information may also only indicate a substantial risk of bodily injury.
- ❖ Emotional: Information indicates psychopathological or disturbed behavior in a child which is documented by a psychiatrist, psychologist or licensed mental health practitioner to be the result of continual scapegoating; rejection or exposure to violence by the child's parent/caretaker.
- ❖ **Sexual:** Information indicates any sexually oriented act, practice, contact, or interaction in which the child is or has been used for the sexual stimulation of a parent, the child, or other person.

#### Neglect:

- **Emotional neglect:** Information which indicates that the child is suffering or has suffered severe negative effects due to a parent's failure to provide the opportunities for normal experience that produce feelings of being loved, wanted, secure and worthy. Lack of such opportunities may impair the child's ability to form healthy relationships with others.
- Physical neglect: Information indicates the failure of the parent to provide for the basic needs, or provide a safe and sanitary living environment for the child.
- Medical Neglect of Handicapped Infant: The withholding of medically indicated treatment (appropriate nutrition, hydration, and medication) from disabled infants with life-threatening conditions. Exceptions include those situations in which the infant is chronically and irreversibly comatose; the provision of this treatment would merely prolong dying or not be effective in ameliorating or correcting all of the infant's life-threatening conditions, and the provision of the treatment itself under these conditions would be inhumane.

**Dependent Child:** No child maltreatment has been identified and information indicates that the parent is or will be unable to care for the child through no fault of the parent due to: parent incapacity or absence including an acute or persistent mental or physical condition which prevents her/him from parenting the child adequately or parent is dying or is dead, is incarcerated, hospitalized or otherwise unavoidably unable to provide care, or the child has extraordinary mental health, emotional, or physical needs which the parent does not have the ability or capacity to meet.

**Information and Referral:** A Department process to document calls received by the Child Abuse and Neglect Hotline that are not reporting child abuse or neglect or dependency. Department staff will provide information and referrals to the caller to assist them with obtaining services or additional information.

**In Process of Assessment:** The status of a Child Abuse and Neglect Report that is currently being assessed. These reports were not completed at the time the data was selected for this report.

**Intake Report:** The process of documenting all child related reports including abuse/neglect, dependent child, and information/referral reports. Intake includes the activities associated with receipt of a report via phone call, fax, email, etc., the decision to accept or not accept the report for further assessment, and the referral of individuals or families to services.

**Law Enforcement in Process:** Reports that have been referred to Law Enforcement and are in process of being investigated by a Law Enforcement Agency or that Law Enforcement has declined to assess. Reports of child abuse and neglect that are sent directly to law enforcement for investigation because the report does not include abuse or neglect allegations of a family member or someone acting in a familial role. These reports are investigated by law enforcement. The Department will assist if requested.

Report Source: The role of the person who made the report to the Abuse/Neglect Hotline.

**Screened Out:** This term is used to describe reports of child abuse and neglect or Dependent Child that are not accepted for further assessment by the Department. These reports do not meet the criteria established by the Department that would cause the Department to intervene.

**Substantiated:** The term substantiated means that a determination was made that the incident of maltreatment did occur and met the level of abuse/neglect as defined in statute. Substantiated means either the incident was substantiated by the Department or a court. Substantiated also includes incidents where the county attorney has filed and the disposition is pending a court decision.

Substantiated Perpetrator: The person who was found to have committed abuse or neglect of a child.

Substantiated Victim: The person who was found to have been a victim of abuse or neglect of a child.

**Unable to Locate:** Subjects of the maltreatment report have not been located after a good-faith effort by the Department to locate.

**Unfounded:** The term unfounded means that a determination was made that the incident of maltreatment did not occur or rise to the level of abuse/neglect as defined in statute.
