Aged and Disabled (AD) Waiver



WHAT IS THE AGED AND DISABLED (AD) WAIVER?

The AD waiver provides services for people over the age of 65 and people ages 0-64 who have disabilities. Waiver services are intended to help people live safely in their own homes instead of in a nursing home.

WHAT DO THE AD WAIVER SERVICES INCLUDE:

In general, AD Waiver services include:

- Adult Day Health;
- Assisted Living;
- Assisted Technology;
- Chore;
- Companion;
- Extra Care for Children with Disabilities;
- Home Again;
- Home and Vehicle Modifications;
- Home-Delivered Meals;
- Independence Skills Building;
- Non-Medical Transportation;
- Personal Care;
- Personal Emergency Response System (PERS); and
- Respite.



WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE AD WAIVER?

To be eligible for the AD Waiver, a participant must have a disability or be over the age of 65, be eligible for Medicaid, have a need for waiver services, and meet the level of care for a nursing facility.
