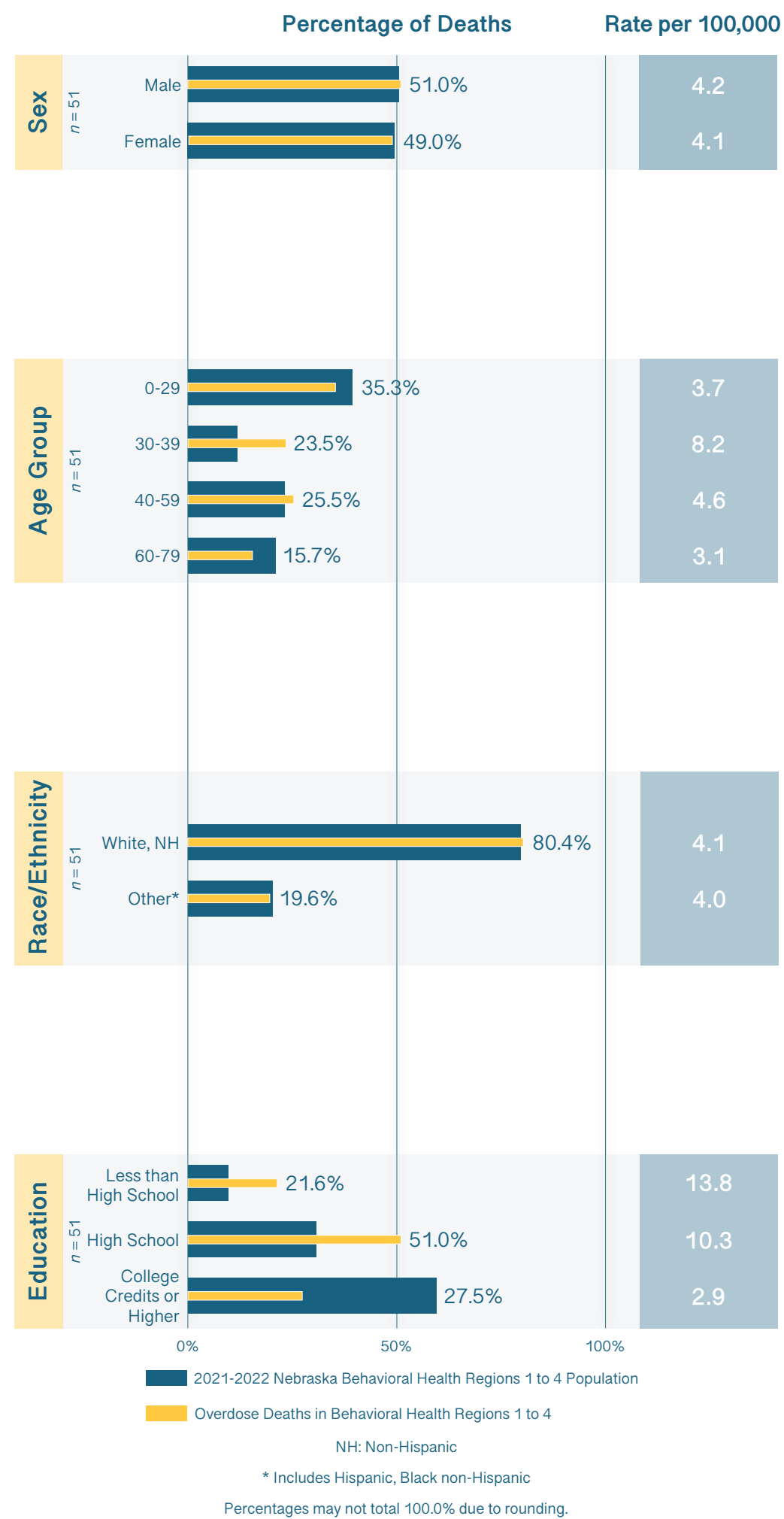


Summary of Drug Overdose Deaths in Behavioral Health Regions 1 to 4 in Nebraska

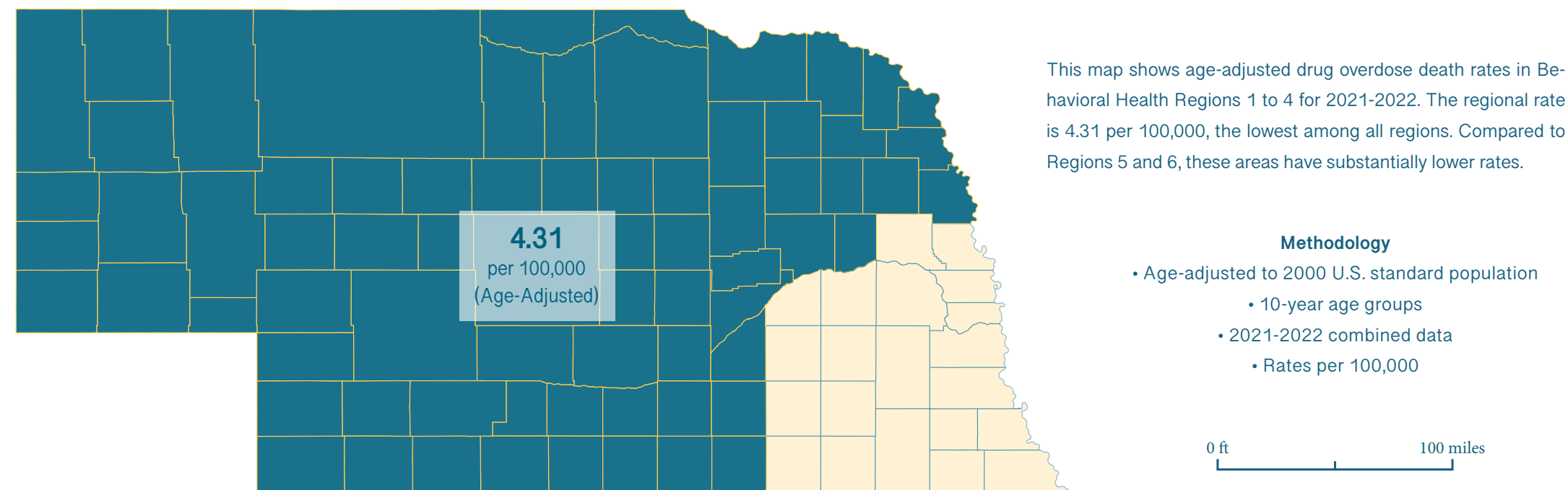

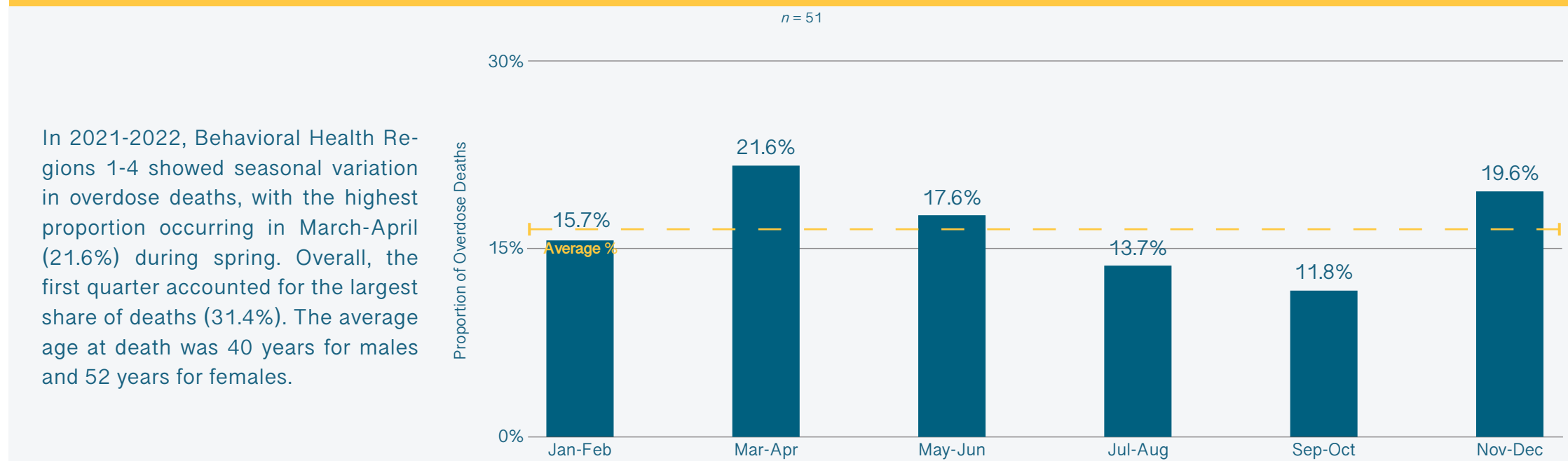


Between 2021 and 2022 in Behavioral Health Regions 1-4, most unintentional and undetermined drug overdose deaths occurred among non-Hispanic White males aged 0-29 with less than a high school education. The average age at death was 34 years for non-Hispanic White males and 43 years for non-Hispanic White females.

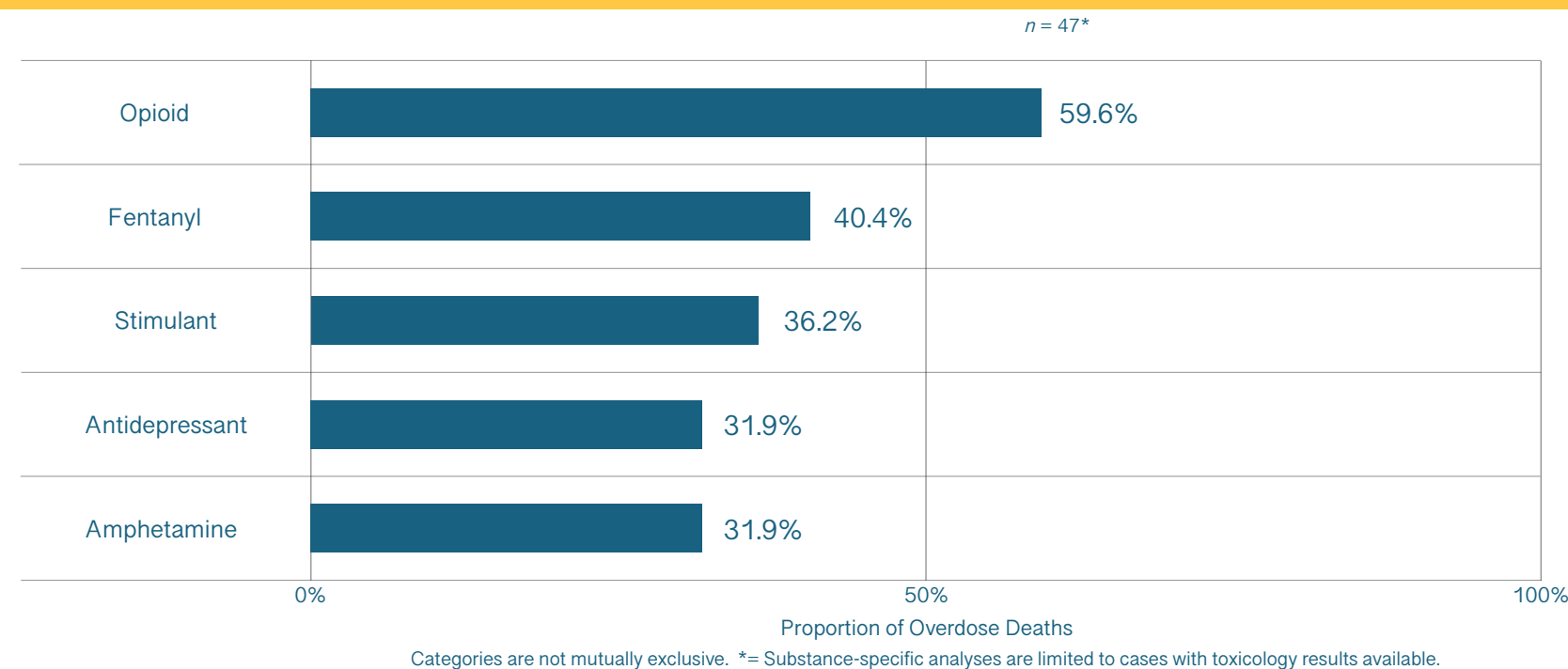
Age-Adjusted Drug Overdose Death Rate by Behavioral Health Regions

Common Substances Identified as the Cause of Death

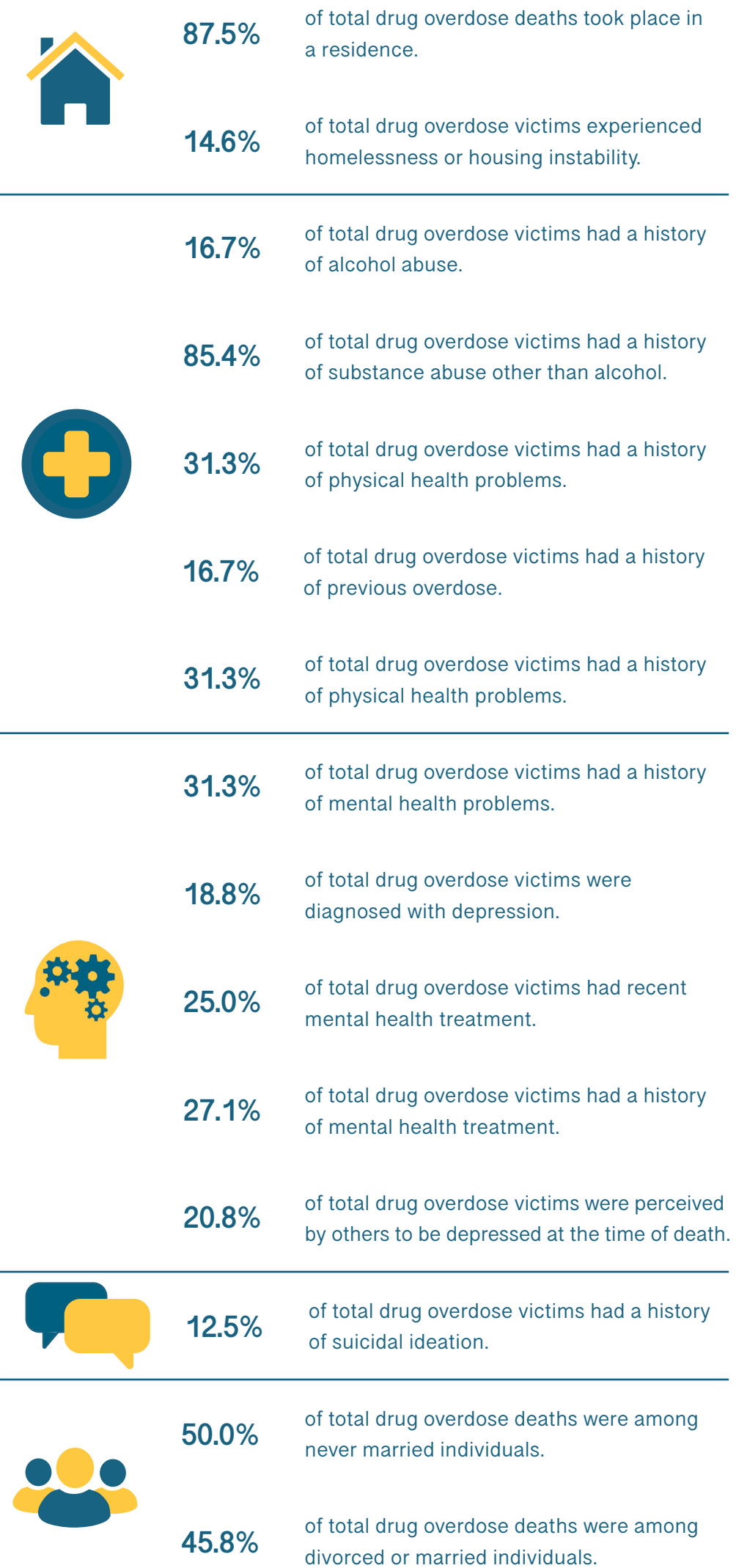


In 2021-2022, opioids were the leading cause of overdose deaths in Regions 1-4, followed by fentanyl, stimulants, antidepressants, and amphetamine. The average age at death was 34 years for males and 43 years for females. Substance patterns were generally similar by sex, though antidepressants ranked second for females and methamphetamine ranked fourth for males.
