

Summary of Homicide Deaths in Nebraska







Between 2021 and 2022 in Nebraska, the highest proportion of homicides among victims occurred among males, White non-Hispanic individuals, aged 20-29, with a high school diploma. However, Black non-Hispanic individuals were disproportionately affected by homicide deaths during this period.

	53.6%	of total homicide deaths took place in a residence.
	10.4%	of total homicide victims experienced homelessness or housing instability.
	9.6%	of total homicide victims had a history of alcohol abuse.
	24.0%	of total homicide victims had a history of substance abuse other than alcohol.
	8.8%	of total victims were killed during an illegal drug dealing.
	8.0%	of total victims were killed by a random act of violence.
	11.2%	of homicide deaths were classified as gang motivated.
	89.6%	of total vitims had emergency medical services present at the scene.
	24.0%	of total victims had 60 mins or less survival time.
	5.6%	of total victims were bystanders, not the intended targets.
	32.0%	of total victims injured during an argument or conflict.
	38.4%	of total victims had an argument or conflict that led to the victim's death.
	15.2%	of total homicide deaths were related to conflict between intimate partners.
	16.8%	of total homicide victims had family or other relationship problems.
