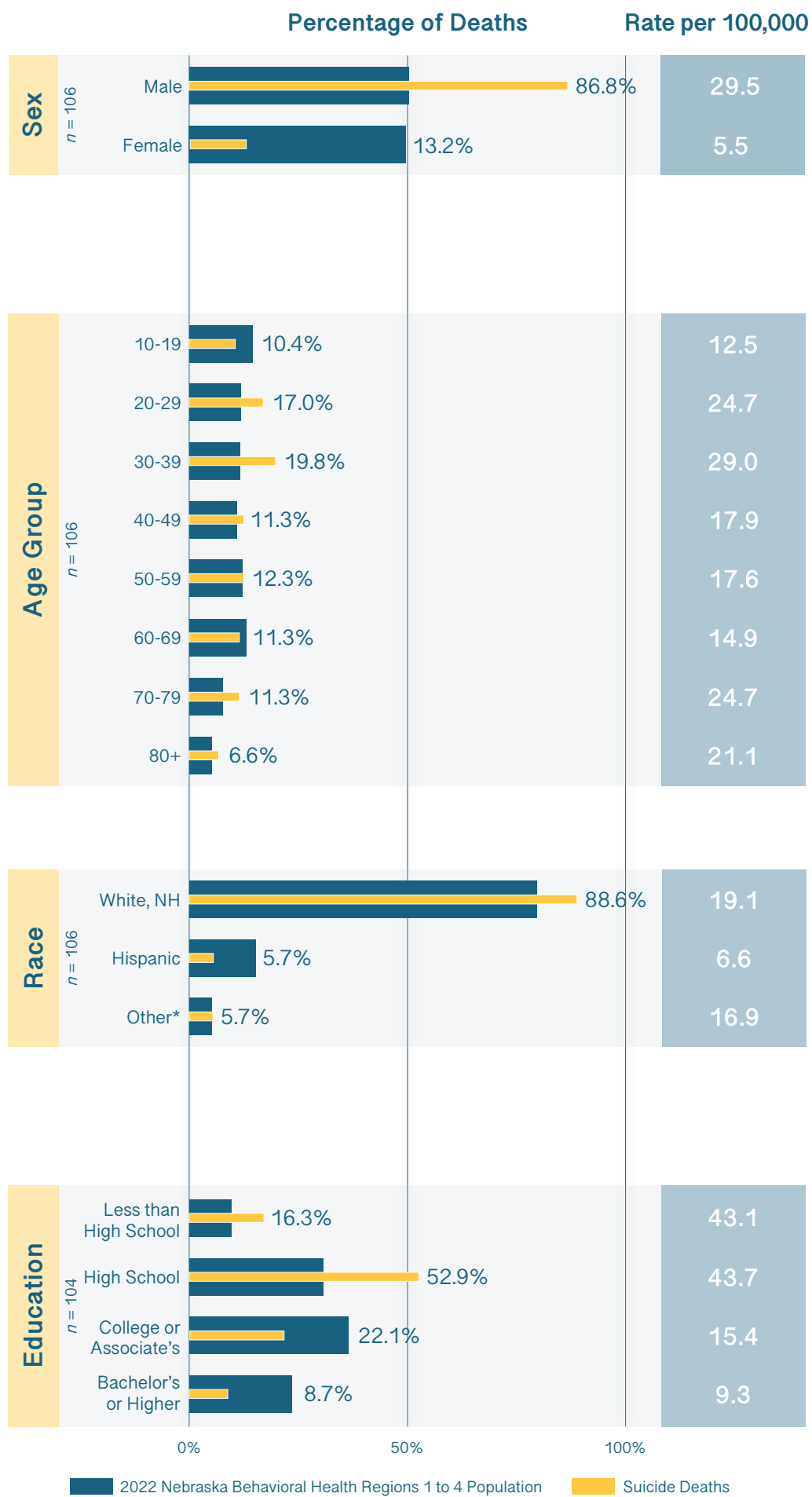


Summary of Suicide Deaths in Behavioral Health Regions 1 to 4 in Nebraska

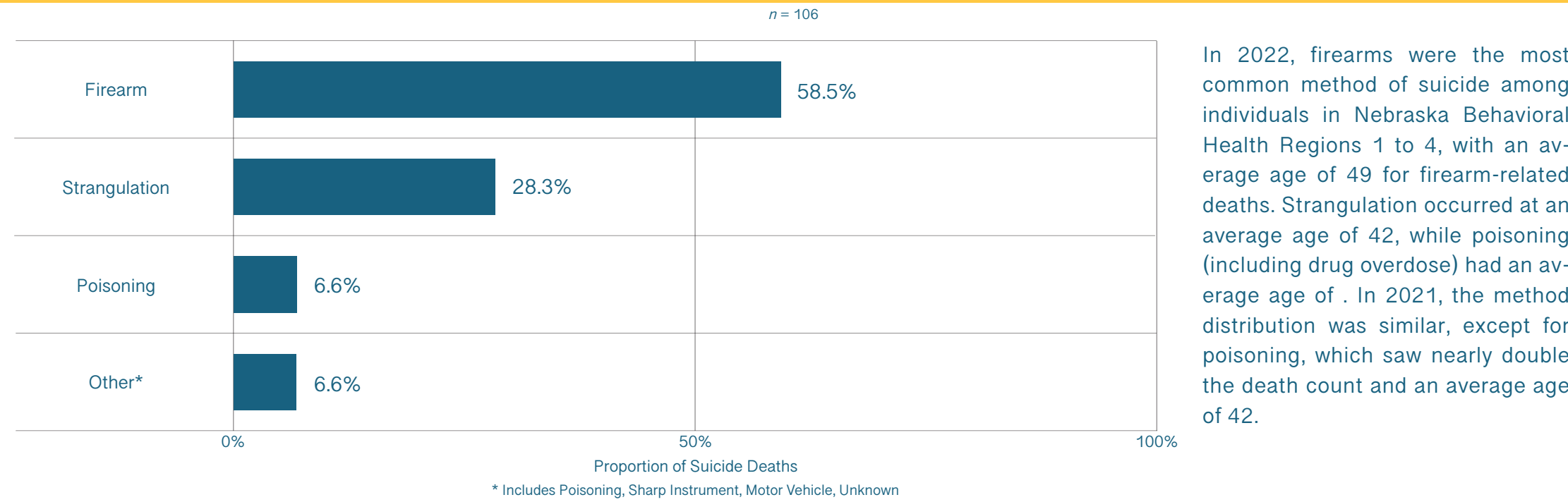
106 Total Deaths (17.2 per 100,000 Population)

Demographic Information



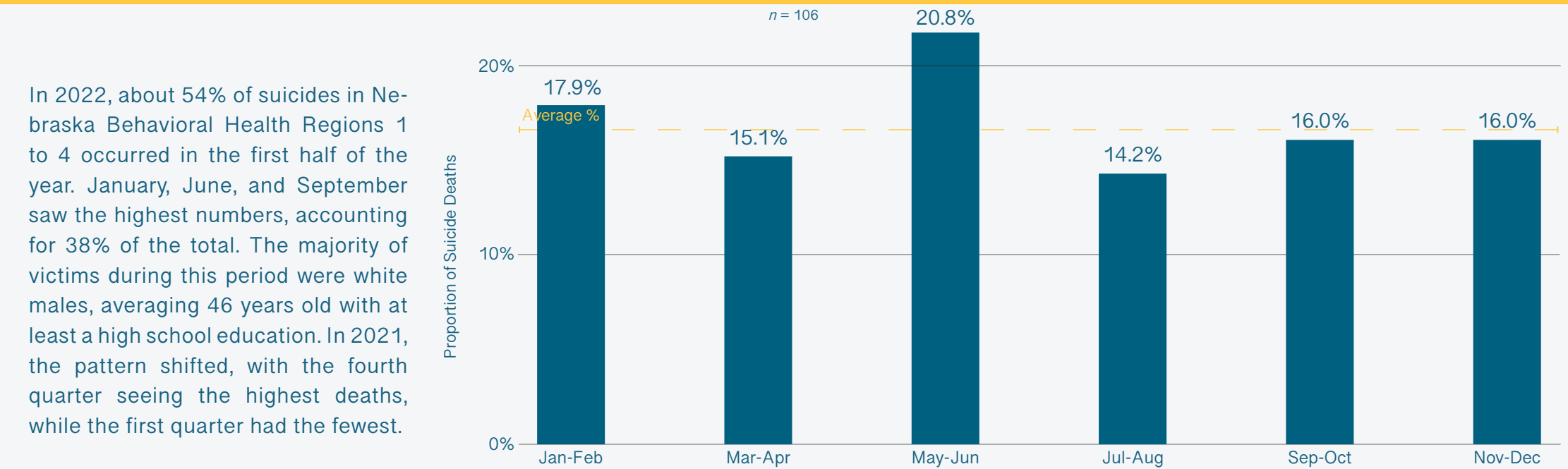
In 2022, suicide victims in Nebraska Behavioral Health Regions 1 to 4 were predominantly white males aged 30-39 with a high school education. Asian/Pacific Islander, American Indian/Alaskan Native, and Black Non-Hispanic males were disproportionately affected. In contrast, 2021 saw the highest suicide rates among the 50-59 age group, with significantly fewer Hispanic suicide deaths.

Cause of Death



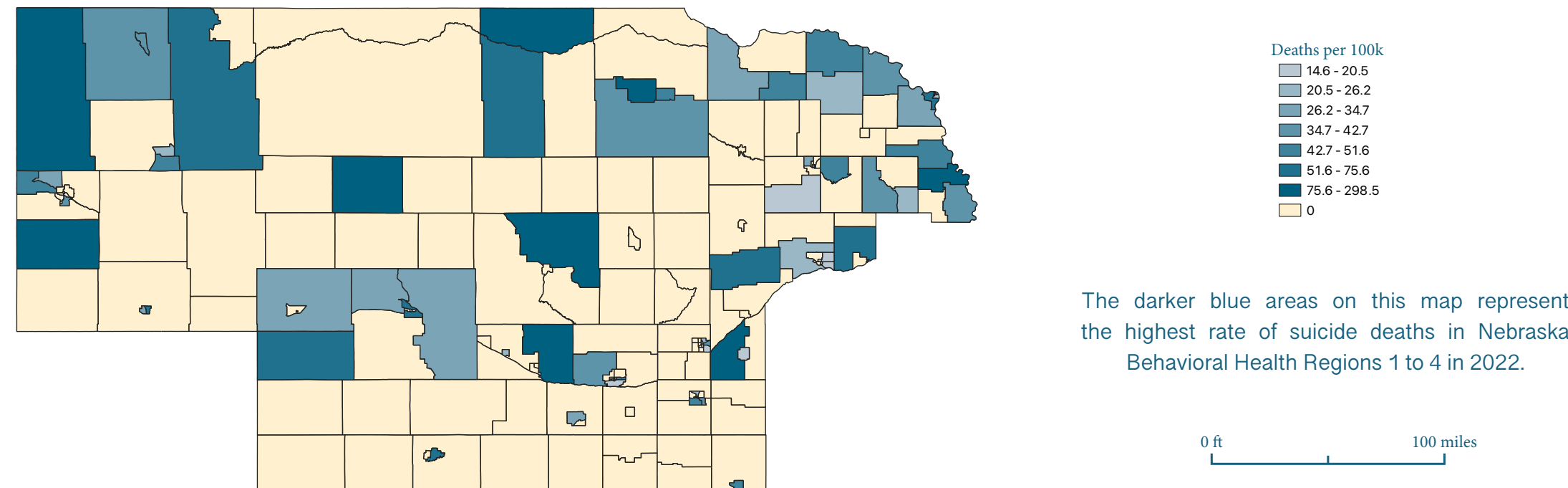
In 2022, firearms were the most common method of suicide among individuals in Nebraska Behavioral Health Regions 1 to 4, with an average age of 49 for firearm-related deaths. Strangulation occurred at an average age of 42, while poisoning (including drug overdose) had an average age of . In 2021, the method distribution was similar, except for poisoning, which saw nearly double the death count and an average age of 42.

Suicide Deaths by Bimonthly



In 2022, about 54% of suicides in Nebraska Behavioral Health Regions 1 to 4 occurred in the first half of the year. January, June, and September saw the highest numbers, accounting for 38% of the total. The majority of victims during this period were white males, averaging 46 years old with at least a high school education. In 2021, the pattern shifted, with the fourth quarter seeing the highest deaths, while the first quarter had the fewest.
