CHAPTER 8 SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER

CHAPTER 8-000 SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER

<u>001.</u> <u>SCOPE AND AUTHORITY.</u> These regulations govern the services provided under Nebraska's Medicaid program as defined by the Medical Assistance Act, Nebraska Revised Statute § 68-901 et seq.

<u>8-001</u> 002. REQUIREMENT OF A SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER (SSN):. Each applicant for or recipient of Nebraska Medicaid is required, as a condition of eligibility, to:

- (A) Furnish his or her Social Security number (SSN); or
- (B) Apply for a Social Security number (SSN) with the Social Security Administration (SSA), if one has not been issued or is not known.
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- 2. Apply for an SSN with the Social Security Administration (SSA), if one has not been issued or is not known.

The SSN, in conjunction with other information, provides evidence of identity of the individual.

8-002 003. EXCEPTIONS TO REQUIREMENT OF AN SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER (SSN)

If an applicant/client refuses to obtain an SSN for a well-established religious objection, the The Department may assign the individual a unique Medicaid identification number as an alternative to an individual who:-

- (A) Is not eligible to receive a Social Security number (SSN);
- (B) Does not have a Social Security number (SSN) and may only be issued a Social Security number (SSN) for a valid non-work reason; or
- (C) Refuses to obtain a Social Security number (SSN) because of well-established religious objections. A well-established religious objection means the applicant or client:
 - (i) Is a member of a recognized religious group or division of the group; and

(ii) Adheres to the tenets or teachings of the group or division of the group, and for that reason is conscientiously opposed to applying for or using a national identification number.

8-002.01 Well-Established Religious Objection: An individual

- 1. Is a member of a recognized religious group or division of the group; and
- 2. Adheres to the tenets or teachings of the group or division of the group, and for that reason is conscientiously opposed to applying for or using a national identification number.

<u>8-003</u> 004. APPLICATION FOR AN SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER (SSN). An applicant who has not previously applied for an Social Security number (SSN) shall be given ninety (90) days from the date of application to verify that he/ or she has submitted an application with the Social Security Administration (SSA). An applicant shall not be eligible after the ninety (90)-day period unless verification of the application is received.

<u>8-004</u> 005. <u>ASSISTANCE PENDING VERIFICATION</u>: After the applicant/ or clientbeneficiary has been referred to the Social Security Administration (SSA), if s/he is otherwise eligible, assistance shall not be delayed, denied, or discontinued pending the verification or assignment of an Social Security number (SSN).

<u>8-005</u> **006. APPLICATION FOR A NEWBORN:** An Social Security number (SSN) is not an eligibility requirement through the month a child turns one (1) if Nebraska Medicaid paid for the birth.

<u>8-006</u> 007. INDIVIDUALS NOT SEEKING MEDICAID: An individual not seeking Medicaid assistance shall not be required to provide or apply for an Social Security number (SSN).
