Visit [HealthCare.gov](https://www.healthcare.gov) as soon as possible to update your Marketplace application for 2020.

Nebraska has added new Medicaid coverage for adults, which may offer similar benefits to those you may have now. Nebraska Medicaid covers many health services, like doctor's visits, hospital care, prescriptions, mental health, and addiction treatment. People who have coverage through Nebraska Medicaid may have to pay monthly copayments for health services, but there's a limit to these costs. They're based on monthly income, and some people may not have to pay anything.

Based on information you gave to the Health Insurance Marketplace, someone on your application may be eligible for free or low-cost health coverage through Nebraska Medicaid:

When you update and submit your 2020 Marketplace application, if you apply for financial help, you'll find out if anyone on your application, including the people listed above, is eligible or may be eligible for Nebraska Medicaid. Nebraska Medicaid will contact you if they need more information, or to send you more information about coverage, enrollment, and cost.

Anyone on your application who's found eligible for Nebraska Medicaid probably won't want to keep their Marketplace coverage if they're found eligible for Medicaid that counts as qualifying coverage. This is because they will no longer be eligible for financial help to help pay for their share of a Marketplace plan premium and covered services. Without this financial help, their Marketplace coverage will cost more than coverage through Nebraska Medicaid.

### **What should I do next?**

Update and submit your 2020 Marketplace application as soon as possible. If anyone is found eligible for Nebraska Medicaid, they should end their Marketplace coverage as soon as their Nebraska Medicaid begins if they don't want to pay the full cost of their Marketplace plan premium and covered services. Here's how:

1. Visit [HealthCare.gov](https://www.healthcare.gov), log into your Marketplace account, and select your **2020** Marketplace application.
2. Update and submit your 2020 application.
3. Review your 2020 "Eligibility Results." Some household members may be eligible for Nebraska Medicaid. Others may be eligible to buy a Marketplace plan with or without financial help. Be sure to follow all steps for enrollment.

**Important: If your updated "Eligibility Results" say anyone on your application is eligible or may be eligible for Nebraska Medicaid, visit [HealthCare.gov/medicaid-chip/cancelling-marketplace-plan](https://www.healthcare.gov/medicaid-chip/cancelling-marketplace-plan) for next steps and information about ending Marketplace coverage for those people.**

Remember, anyone who's found eligible for Nebraska Medicaid that counts as qualifying coverage will owe the full cost of their share of the Marketplace plan premium and covered services if they still want to have a Marketplace plan.
