



# Why it's important to become a presumptive eligibility provider:

Nebraska Medicaid providers can become presumptive eligibility (PE) providers to help pregnant mothers in Nebraska access the care they need as soon as possible.

## How to become a presumptive eligibility provider:

1. The staff member making PE determinations must first complete the [PE training](#) and sign the [Confirmation of Training](#) form.

2. The signed Confirmation of Training form must be submitted to Nebraska Medicaid by emailing [DHHS.MedicaidPE@nebraska.gov](mailto:DHHS.MedicaidPE@nebraska.gov).
3. Completing these steps confirms that the provider agrees to make PE determinations consistent with Nebraska policy and procedure. Per [477 NAC 19-008.08\(C\)](#), Hospital providers are required to assist pregnant individuals in completing and submitting a Nebraska Medicaid application ([MLTC-53](#)).
4. Nebraska Medicaid will ensure that the requirements are met and will inform the PE provider that they can begin making PE Determinations.
