# Maternal Mortality in Nebraska

2014-2023

In the United States, too many women die from causes related to pregnancy. To help make sure that everyone has a fair shot at health and well-being, we can all take steps to help prevent more than 8 in 10 U.S. pregnancy-related deaths. That's where Maternal Mortality Review Committees (MMRCs) come in. MMRCs meet at the local or state level and work to understand these deaths. They develop promising strategies to prevent pregnancy-related deaths and help ensure the best possible birth outcomes.

#### **Pregnancy-Related Mortality Ratio (PRMR)**

### **Leading Causes of Pregnancy-Related Deaths**

Cardiovascular conditions are the leading cause of pregnancy-related deaths in Nebraska, causing 16.2% of these deaths from

2014-2023



Other leading causes:

- Hemorrhage (excluding aneurysm),
- Embolism-thrombotic (non-cerebral), 10.8%
- Injury, 10.8%

The odds of pregnancy-related death are 3.2 times higher for Non-**Hispanic Black** mothers than for Non-**Hispanic White** mothers.

#### **Definitions**

Pregnancy-associated death: A death during or within one year of pregnancy irrespective of

Pregnancy-associated but not -related death: A death during or within one year of the end of pregnancy from a cause that is not related to pregnancy.

Pregnancy-related death: A death while pregnant or within one year of the end of pregnancy from a pregnancy complication, a chain of events initiated by pregnancy, or the aggravation of an unrelated condition by the physiologic effects of pregnancy. (Ask: "If she had not been pregnant, would she have died?")
