Re:	COVID-19 Vaccine

This provider bulletin is being issued to inform providers about the COVID-19 vaccines, which providers will be allowed to administer these vaccines, and how to bill Nebraska Medicaid for the administration of these vaccines.

## **INFORMATION FOR MEDICAID PROVIDERS**

Effective December 1, 2020, Medicaid-enrolled providers who administer a COVID-19 vaccine to Medicaid eligible patients according to the federal Food and Drug Administration's prescribing indications will be reimbursed for the administration of the vaccine. Participating providers have two options for billing Medicaid for this vaccination: (1) file a medical claim or (2) bill at the point of sale in a pharmacy. Medicaid is the payer of last resort, so Medicare and primary insurance must be billed first for the administration, if applicable.

The COVID-19 vaccine is not supplied by the Vaccines for Children's (VFC) Program; therefore, the vaccine administration may be billed without the CPT code and SL modifier and may be reimbursed in the retail pharmacy. There is no co-payment or deductible for members.

## HOW TO BILL NEBRASKA MEDICAID: Medical Claim Billing Option

HCPCS	Description				Reimbursement Rate
0001A	Pfizer-Biotech COVID administration 1 <sup>st</sup> dose	_	19	Vaccine	\$16.94
0002A	Pfizer-Biotech COVID administration 2 <sup>nd</sup> dose	_	19	Vaccine	\$28.39

The following administration billing codes are covered:

0011A	Moderna COVID – 19 Vaccine administration 1 <sup>st</sup> dose	\$16.94
0012A	Moderna COVID – 19 Vaccine administration 2 <sup>nd</sup> dose	\$28.39

Single-dose vaccine administration will be reimbursed at \$28.39, when those vaccines are available.

Important points to know:

- (1) Administration of a COVID-19 vaccine is a carve-out service for long-term care facilities and providers who are reimbursed through the EAPG payment system and the administration can be billed in addition to the daily per diem; and
- (2) Rural health care clinics, Indian Health Services, and federally qualified health centers will be reimbursed the encounter payment for COVID-19 administration.

## HOW TO BILL NEBRASKA MEDICAID: Pharmacy Point of Sale Billing Option

The federal Public Readiness and Emergency Preparedness Act (PREP Act) authorizes a state-licensed pharmacist to order and administer certain COVID-19 vaccines, as long as the pharmacist has met the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) training requirements and state regulations for training for vaccine administration.

- An administration fee will be reimbursed, at the fees listed above, using NCPDP billing; and
- No dispensing fee will be reimbursed, only an administration fee.

The ordering provider may be the ordering pharmacist or collaborating practitioner. The billing provider will be the pharmacy.

For pharmacy system billing of a COVID-19 vaccine, the administration must be billed using the following NCPDP logic:

- Enter the vaccinating pharmacist or the collaborating practitioner as the prescriber and include their NPI number as the Prescriber ID;
- Enter Prescription Origin Code "5" (Pharmacy);
- Enter Product/Service ID as the vaccine NDC number;
- The Ingredient Cost Submitted should have a value of \$0 or \$0.01;
- A basis of Cost Determination value of "15" (free product or no associated cost);
- Enter the Professional Service Code of MA (Medication Administered); and,
- For two-dose COVID vaccines:
  - $\circ~$  Initial dose use Submission Clarification Code "2" (Other Override); and
  - Final dose use Submission Clarification Code "6" (Starter Dose).

A pharmacist trained to order a COVID-19 vaccine must enroll as a group member of a Medicaid-enrolled pharmacy to be listed as the ordering provider on the NCPDP claim. Maximus is the provider screening and enrollment contractor for Nebraska Medicaid.

In a pharmacy, COVID-19 vaccine administration may alternatively be billed using the CMS-1500 or 837: Professional claim using the medical billing instructions as above.
