**Re:** November 2021 COVID-19 Vaccine Updates

This provider bulletin is being issued to notify Medicaid providers of the following:

- New updates on booster doses of the COVID-19 vaccine
- COVID-19 vaccinations for children ages 5-11

## 1. COVID-19 Booster Doses:

Medicaid will cover booster doses of the Moderna and J&J/Janssen COVID-19 vaccines in addition to booster doses of the Pfizer vaccine as indicated in Provider Bulletin 21-19A.

Medicaid will cover an additional dose of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine, at least 6 months after their Moderna primary series, for the following individuals:

- 65 years and older and residents residing in long-term care setting **should** receive a booster shot;
- 50 to 64 years with underlying medical conditions **should** receive a booster shot;
- 18 to 49 years with underlying medical conditions **may** receive a booster shot; and
- 18 to 49 years at increased risk for COVID-19 exposure and transmission because of their occupational or institutional setting <u>may</u> receive a booster shot.

Medicaid will cover an additional dose of the J&J/Janssen COVID-19 vaccine, at least 2 months after their J&J/Janssen primary dose, for the following individuals:

People ages 18 years and older who received a J&J/Janssen COVID-19 vaccine at least 2 months
ago <u>should</u> receive a booster dose. The patient may choose which type of COVID-19 vaccine to
receive as their booster dose.

If a provider chooses to administer a booster dose of the vaccine that is a different brand than the original series the patient received, Medicaid will still cover the booster dose.

Tribal Clinics will be paid the all-inclusive rate for the administration of COVID-19 vaccine booster doses.

## 2. COVID-19 vaccinations for children:

The FDA and CDC has approved the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine for children ages 5-11. The vaccine is a two-dose series, 21 days apart, and at a lower dosage amount than the adult dose.
