## 17. Approval of Meeting Minutes

Timothy Heller made a motion to approve minutes as presented, motion 2<sup>nd</sup> by Kathy Hoell. The minutes were approved as presented.

# 18. Report from Partners for Insightful Evaluation on the progress of the Olmstead Plan Evaluation to be submitted to the Legislature by December 15, 2024.

a. Liz Gebhart-Morgan Update on online surveys for Individuals with Disabilities, Families and Caregivers of Individuals with Disabilities, and Workgroup Members

- Two surveys, four focus groups; interviews with key partners at state agencies and collected administrative date- Looking at other Midwest states Olmstead plans-States included are Colorado, Iowa, Minnesota, Missouri, North Carolina, North Dakota, and Ohio. A request to add Michigan to the list was made.
- First survey went out to Workgroup members, partners, and key advocates. It was sent to 83 individuals and was open for 6 weeks with 54% participant rate.
- Second survey sent to individuals at key organizations across the state to disseminate to individuals with disabilities. Family members and caregivers could also take the survey on behalf of individuals with disabilities. This survey was also open for 6 weeks with 38% of the respondents were from the perspective of those with a disability and rest were from family or caregivers.
- b. Update on Focus Groups for Individuals with Disabilities, Families and Caregivers of Individuals with Disabilities, and Workgroup Members
  - One of the focus groups included Family Members/Caregivers -Promoted to 20 individuals who responded to the survey and held April 4th at 6 pm. Two people participated and five provided feedback online.
  - Second focus group Individuals with Disabilities -was held on April 9 at 6pm and had 4 people participate and 2 give feedback. Had a few who were not comfortable doing it online so to make it accessible we put the focus group question in an online form and sent it ot everyone who was invited to the focus group so they could provide feedback. We had five individuals for family members and caregivers get feedback through the avenue and then 2 people for the individuals with disability both completed online instead of participating in the workgroup.
  - Workgroup members focus group- range of individuals from the workgroups, It was held on April 5 at 10 am. Had 6 participated and 1 provided feedback through questions online.
  - o DHHS focus group is being scheduled.
- c. Update on other activities to date
  - O Key informant interviews 15 people- Focus on organizations including four Divisions with the Dept of Health and Human Services; Dept of Education, Dept of Labor, Dept of Transportation tried to get a range of work groups. The first question we asked was how familiar they are with the Olmstead plan- 49% said not familiar; 41 said somewhat; 10% said very. Part of PIE report will highlight some suggestions that come from the focus group to helpfully increase the awareness of the Olmstead Plan.
  - Next step for PIE-Analyze data and do a few more key informant interviews. PIE will be drafting the final report including recommendations, Sharing the draft recommendations with Olmstead Plan Staff by Mid July to identify work that needs modified for the next iteration.
  - Would like to add plan revisions or changes being added to the agenda sooner than next summer so the Committee can get started on it. -One of the

- discussions articulated with PIE is that we only have three years' worth of goals and that we would have a full rework to look at in a comprehensive way in order to hit the next fiscal year beyond what the current plan talks about that we are looking at next summer to get it moving and out the door.
- Concerns that there is a plan rolling out when simultaneously have a new proposal to eliminate the wait list that hasn't been integrated. Seems to be a disconnect in the core portion of the plan. Two other challenges that aren't as much in our control which is addressing the requirements of the new access rule which should be integrated in here along with the DOL overtime rules that are going to impact access especially when put in comparison with rates.
- Request made to open the survey back up for individuals with disabilities due to the responses being so low. The survey will be opened back up in order to get a few more respondents.

## 19. Report on the status of Olmstead Plan goals and objectives for SFY 2023

- Update on SFY 2023 Olmstead Goals and Objectives
  - i. The progress of the goals is moving and seems to be in progress. The progress is indicated in different colors in the handouts.
- Update on SFY 2024 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter Olmstead Goals and Objectives
  - Concerns with education and employment- not really addressing adults with Mental illness. There is a goal that addresses relates to employment rats after 6 months and over a year and that would be all populations.
  - ii. Lindy volunteered to follow up with NDE special education.
  - iii. Community services would like to incorporate LB276-which lays out the structure for appropriations for Certified community behavioral health clinics. Seems as though it is addressing the community services. In years 26 and 27 looking at providing services through this model.
  - iv. Workgroups met in January- focused on PIE and giving updates on the evaluation.
  - v. A Request for a list of workgroup members was made.
  - vi. Concerns were raised about the Data workgroup having disbanded and it is unclear where or how that information was provided. There are still 6 Olmstead workgroups, which include DATA.

## 20. Discussion of Nebraska Olmstead Advisory Committee By-Laws

Concerns with how often the work groups meet. Need to meet more often than once a year. Advisory and work groups were meeting monthly, in June when the committee voted to submit the plan and to push the plan forward, we have not met since that time as we were trying to get the plan over to the HHS committee. Working to get the plan out, working to get the appointment letters written and signed by the CEO, and then providing timely notice of this meeting, each of those pushed the meeting date a little further out.

- Concerns with having to request virtual accommodation for every meeting. Needs to be modifications and not accommodations- by requiring those with a disability to make a request prior to every meeting is a hardship. Because some have memory issues and it's not something that works. Should be able to make a one-time request for to attend vertically for an indefinite period of time. Voting members can be online but they forfeit they their right to vote on issues.
- The Open Meeting Act outlines the rules to be followed in an open meeting; previously committee was able to meet virtually due to the executive order because of Covid. AG has since said the state needs to return to Open Meetings as outlined in the open meeting act. It was suggested that the state speak with the AG in order to get permission not to follow the Open Meetings Act. State agencies have to follow the Open Meetings Act.
- Need to make it easy for people to make their accommodations. It is written in the bylaws that members may request a standing accommodation that will last throughout their term on the committee. Suggestions to remove 5 business days and remove the ambiguity about accommodations in the bylaws and make it modifications.
