

Services to families with identified children experiencing behaviors, conditions, or circumstances that are likely to have adverse impacts on a child's development or functioning, but do not present immediate safety concerns	
CTDCF will develop contracts with an outside Care Management Entity (CME) to work with families, local providers and CTDCF	Schools, sister agencies, faith-based organizations, etc.
CME will collaborate with community partners to identify and engage potentially eligible children and families, with referrals from:	 - 211
CME will conduct initial assessments, evaluate risk, develop prevention plan, and make eligibility recommendation CTDCF	Careline: indirect referrals for calls not accepted by the Hotline

CTDCF will review and make final eligibility determination



NEW YORK

New York State children who meet the criteria for enrollment in the state's Healthy Families America (HFA) program, referred to as Healthy Families New York (HFNY), will be categorically


For families also receiving preventive services, eligibility is

approved as "candidates for foster care"

For families receiving Healthy Family NY, without a concurrent preventive services case:

In Wave 2, New York State will expand its criteria to include children identified directly by sister state agencies and/or contracted community-based provider agencies that do not have an active preventive services case but meet the criteria for preventive services







Collaboration Healthy Families America/Indiana Healthy Families will engage, assess for risks, and plan for safety and services with their HFI families on a regular basis

DCS will "supervise the activities performed by the contracted agency ... and make the determination that a child is a candidate for foster care."

Indiana Family Preservation Services (INFPS) services

Being evaluated as an EBP for submission to the IV-E Clearinghouse Families that have had an incident of abuse and/or neglect

Family assessment, a framework of concrete supports, and services classified at a minimum as a promising practice on the California Evidence-Based Clearinghouse



WASHINGTON DC

Families that come to the attention of child welfare are referred to one of five community collaboratives

Families in the child welfare system that could be safely referred to services in the community based on clinical assessment

Collaboratives connect families to a range of community services

Washington, D.C., saw Family First as an opportunity to embed motivational interviewing (MI) as a core approach for supporting families across agencies Provide case management using motivational interviewing to connect families to specific services based on their needs.

May have been substantiated for child abuse or neglect but now have low or moderate risk, and families with high levels of risk but no substantiated finding

CFSA is now partnering with other government and community agencies to further expand access to services

Culturally relevant programs like Effective Black Parenting and multi-lingual Parent Cafés

Engages people with lived experience in the child welfare system to guide their culturally relevant offerings



A Florida candidate for the Title IV-E Prevention Program is defined as a child or youth, formally assessed through community engagement or abuse hotline reporting to be at-risk of entering foster care, who can remain safely in their home or in a kinship placement with evidence-based prevention services delivered by/through community-based service networks (CBCs, Children Services Councils, or other county prevention agencies) or the Department of Children and Families

Children assessed as safe as a result of an investigation or no abuse or neglect has been alleged, but the parent or caregiver is requesting assistance DCF Care Navigation Support Team

Children determined to be unsafe due to an active danger threat in the home require oversight and formal safety and case management

Referred to CBC Lead Agency for services and case management by a certified professional

Florida's Path Forward, Phase 4 will formally establish a community pathway to FFPSA services

"No wrong door" to access community-based, coordinated, quality, and evidence-based services
