IMPROVING OVERALL HEALTH & ACCESS TO CARE

THE PROBLEM:

In 2022, only 3 in 10 Nebraska children aged 9-35 months received a developmental screening using a parent-completed screening tool in the past year.

Almost 1 in 5 children Nebraska's children (aged O-5) received no preventive health visits during the past 12 months from a doctor, nurse, or other health care professional.

THE IMPACT:

The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that all children have a developmental screening during their regular well-child checks at 9, 18, and 24 or 30 months.

When children miss preventive health visits, they also miss opportunities to be screened for developmental delays.
