NEBRASKA TOBACCO FACTS

Every year, Nebraska spends \$900 in taxes per household for smoking-related costs, such as health care and loss of productivity.⁴

- Adult smoking rate: 12.1% in 2023.¹
- Adult smokeless tobacco use rate: 4.4% in 2023.¹
- Youth (grades 9-12) smoking rate: 1.9% in 2023.²
- Youth who use smokeless tobacco (chew): 1.9% in 2023.²
- Youth who tried to quit using all tobacco products: 64.3% in 2023.²
- Youth who currently use electronic vapor products: 6.9% in 2023.²
- Over 2,500 Nebraskans die each year from smoking-attributable causes.³
- Nebraska kids (under 18) who will become new daily smokers each year: 230.3
- Annual smoking-related medical expenses: \$924 million.³
- Annual cost of lost productivity due to smoking: \$651.9 million.⁴
- 91.2% of Nebraskans agree that inhaling secondhand smoke is harmful to children and adults.⁵
- The smoking rate among pregnant women in Nebraska: 4.4% in 2021.6
