However, there are instances where the current restrictions to utilize fluoroscopy in my specialty practice hinders my ability to fully utilize my training and expertise. Not only does this impact the efficiency and timeliness of care delivery but may also affect patient satisfaction and outcomes. Addressing this challenge is crucial to ensuring that patients receive the most effective and comprehensive care possible.

The proposed education and practice hours will ensure that NPs are well-prepared to use fluoroscopy safely. This change will enhance our ability to meet evolving healthcare needs and improve patient outcomes. With Nebraska facing healthcare provider shortages, allowing NPs to use fluoroscopy would increase the healthcare access points across the state. It's disheartening when I can't fully use my training and expertise to adequately provide care in times of need because of the limitations with fluoroscopy. I am the replacement to a retired PA in an orthopedic practice and I am expected to be prepared to perform in the same capacity.

I urge you to support this proposal, which will positively impact healthcare delivery in our state, more specifically the underserved and rural areas where NPs are highly relied upon to provide high-quality, patient-centered care.
