Date September 28-30, 2023, in San Diego, CA Friday September 29th:

 - Many states are facing some form of deregulation. Alabama was just notified by their Sunset Committee that their board will be eliminated as of 10/30/2024.
 - Establishment license movement
 - > TX & GA schools (World of Beauty and Footy Rooty)
- Human Trafficking in Illicit Massage Chris Muller- Tabanera, Chief Strategy Officer, The Network.
 - Looked at the victim workers.
 - 30–60-year-old women from China, South Korea, Thailand, and Vietnam.
 - Promised jobs in the US.
 - ➢ Need to create Inoperable Environment
 - Success Strategies Landlord letters Inform. Educate. Motivate
 - Organization Franchise model
 - The Network can provide a list of suspected IMB. <u>https://www.thenetworkteam.org</u>
 - > Doesn't work arresting women. Need to arrest buyers.

 - > Types of Illicit Massage Business.
 - Local local ties real estate, bank accounts. Family/children locally
 - Domestic Few local ties. Family in CA or NY
 - International no ties to community. Family international. Connection to NY/CA.
 - Several IMB have connection to CA or NY addresses.
 - One address is 4170 Main Street Suite B3531 Flushing NY
 - NE has 8 LMTs from Flushing and one that matches this address.


• Estimated that each state has at least 8 IMB.

Saturday September 30th:

- Election of new Board members
 - ► Karen Frazier, KY and Liz Barnard, NV
- MBLEx
 - > Changed to Palm in Palm out protect the integrity of the exam.
 - ▶ 46 jurisdictions require the MBLEx.
 - ▶ July 2022-June 2023 17,400 MBLEx candidates tested with a 72% first-time pass rate.
 - FSMTB has partnered with The Network to coauthor an article examining massage licensing fraud in education.
- IMpact
 - Nevada is the only state to approve it.
 - > Missouri may be the 2^{nd} .
 - Many states are not interested.
 - ➢ Need 7 states to start.
- Regulatory Cases and Trends



> Does our Practice Act say our board has exclusive authority to define scope?



- > Discussed if the Federal Government can force this on a State.
- Illicit Massage Industry
 - Massage Therapy Licensing Database (MTLD) Comprehensive, national databank of Licensed massage therapists that facilitates information sharing between state massage regulatory boards and agencies.
 - National Practitioner Data Bank a web-based repository of reports containing information on medical malpractice payments and certain adverse actions related to health care practitioners, providers, and suppliers.
