

RE: NOTICE OF ILLICIT ACTIVITY BY TENANT

Dear Mr. Doc.

The Georgia Attorney General's Office has obtained information indicating that your tenant, Jane Doe, may be operating an illicit massage business at violation of Georgia law and Cherokee County ordinances. Specifically, our investigation indicates that Massage Spa, located at 234 Main Street. Atlanta, GA 30327, may be offering or performing commercial sex acts. As an example of information received by our office, please see the enclosure included with this letter.

Continercial sexual activity is illegal in the State of Georgia. Criminal statutes prohibiting commercial sex include: O.C.G.A. §§ 16-S-46 (Human Trafficking), 16-6-9 (Proxitation), 16-6-10 (Keeping a place of prostitution), 16-6-11 (Pumping), and 16-6-12 (Pandering). Operating an Illian Massage Business is also a violation of the Cherokee County Code of Ordinances, Division 6.— Massage Practitioners, Sec. 18-236, through Sec. 18-258.

As landlord of the property in question, it is your responsibility to take appropriate action to address illicit activity on your property. Pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 44-7-18, any lease for the purpose of prostitution is void.

This letter places you on notice that eminial activity may be occurring on your premises. Continued criminal activity at this focation could subject you to potential legal consequences. You should consult legal coursel regarding this matter.

You are requested to provide this office with your response to this letter within 30 calendar days. Contact the Attorney General's Office at 404–458-3247 to acknowledge the receipt of this letter. Thank you for your attention to this matter.
