Minutes of the June 30, 2023 Board of Hearing Instrument Specialists Meeting

1. ROLL CALL

Chairperson, Ed Granger, called the meeting of the Board of Hearing Instrument Specialists to order at 1:17 p.m. on June 30, 2023, in the Lower-Level Conference Room A, at the Nebraska State Office Building located at 301 Centennial Mall South, Lincoln, Nebraska. In accordance with Neb. Rev. 2. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

MOTION: Lutt-Chmiel moved, seconded by Robinson, to adopt the agenda. Voting aye: Granger, Lutt-Chmiel, Robinson, and Pritchett. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

3. APPROVAL OF THE 2.24.2023 MEETING MINUTES

Pritchett moved, seconded by Lutt-Chmiel, to approve the 2.24.2023 meeting minutes. Voting aye: Granger, Lutt-Chmiel, Robinson, and Pritchett. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

4. INVESTIGATIONAL & CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION/REPORTS – CLOSED SESSION

The Board did not move into closed session.

5. BOARD RECOMMENDATIONS ON APPLICATIONS

No recommendations were made.

6. IHS PRACTICAL EXAM

Covert-ByBee indicated that if Nebraska adopted the International Hearing Society's practical exam in lieu of the current exam, there is a \$200.00 fee per candidate and providing proctors would still be necessary. Currently, Nebraska uses an exam developed by the Board and does not charge a fee to take the exam. Covert-ByBee advised that switching to the IHS exam would require a change in regulations and costs would increase for the applicants. Using the IHS practical exam would also provide more uniformity between jurisdictions, potentially making it less prohibitive to obtain licensure in multiple states. Covert-ByBee will contact IHS and ask them to do a presentation at the October 2023 Board meeting.

7. UPDATE ON THE NEW LICENSURE DATABASE

Covert-ByBee advised that the Department signed an emergency contract with System Automation to help stabilize the current database, LIS. The project kicked off on June 15th and completion of this phase is set for January 1, 2025. Simultaneously, the Department is working of revamping an RFP for the second phase, expansion of services.

8. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Covert-ByBee stated that approximately thirty bills were amended into LB227, which became the DHHS omnibus bill, and largely does not affect Hearing Instrument Specialists. A bill was introduced to expand the scope of practice for Hearing Instrument Specialists to include cerumen management however that bill did not progress, and will be held over until the next legislative session. The 407 Credentialing Review Program is the preferred method for regulation promulgation, and would allow the Board to include the IHS practical exam in regulations.
